Pastor's Corner for October 13-19, 2024

Love of Jesus (Mark 10:17-22)

What does it look like to be a Christian? We, and the world, have a lot of answers to that question. Maybe it's appearance; clean and polite, a whole family with smiles all the time. Maybe it's actions; gives to the poor, always helping others, saying nice things. Maybe it's habits; at church all the time, reading the Bible and praying constantly. Some thoughts may be positive, some negative, but everyone has an idea of what a Christian looks like.

The rich man in Mark's Gospel was wrestling with this idea when he asked Jesus, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" They have a short discussion about the commandments, when the man proudly says, "all these I have kept from my youth." But that wasn't the answer Jesus was looking for. Are keeping the commandments good? Yes, absolutely! As Christians, it's part of our calling to live out the will of, but is that what makes a Christian? Is that what gives us eternal life? No! The man was too focused on his looking up at God, his ability to do things and then looking toward God as if to say, "have you seen what I did?? I'm doing everything you asked, do I have eternal life now??" He has it all backwards.

And Jesus, looking at him, loved him (Mark 10:21a)

The appearance of a Christian is when Jesus looks at us, shining His light of grace, mercy, and forgiveness. When we meet the eyes of Jesus, we recognize that all our actions and stuff can't get us into Heaven, they don't make us a Christian. Instead, we see the love of Jesus giving us a new identity, making us different, and gifting us eternal life!

Then comes the action. Because Jesus looks upon us, shining His loving light on us, we are able to reflect that light to those in need. And opportunities to shine that light abound. Last week, we focused on opportunities to shine light on Western NC through the efforts of our Southeastern District. We will continue to collect items all through the month of October. This week, we are adding another opportunity to shine the light of Jesus with the help of Shaelyn Kerns. She is an active member of RLC, and a graduate of both RLP and RLS. Currently, Shaelyn is a student at Appalachian State and works in the healthcare field of Watauga County. She has asked if we could collect items (see list below and at the Information Tables in the Narthex and Family Life Center) to help support her area of ministry, and we are joyful to join her in God's Mission in Western NC.

As Jesus looks at us, giving us His identity as Christians, may we then reflect that light by helping those He places before us!


The Holy Land Christians and Crafts
