# Twenty-Second Sunday After Pentecost October 20, 2024



Pastor's Corner for October 20-26, 2024

Kept Occupied by Joy (Ecclesiastes 5:10-20)

The book of Ecclesiastes (also known by its Hebrew name, "Qoheleth," translated "Preacher") is one of those books of the Bible that may not seem at first to mesh with the Good Book's more upbeat portions. Be it reverently said, much that the Preacher has to say, when taken out of context, wouldn't look good on a DaySpring or Hallmark greeting card! The Preacher tells us that the dead may be "more fortunate than the living" (4:3). He assures us that there is not only "a time to love" but also "a time to hate" (3:8). And how's this for heart-warming and encouraging: "All the toil of a man is for his mouth, yet his appetite is not satisfied" (6:7)?

So, it does not surprise us to see that the Preacher's wisdom on the topic of money — our appointed OT reading this weekend — begins on a similarly pessimistic note. Not being satisfied with what one has, he says, and loving money, is "vanity."

Keeping one's wealth to oneself is "a grievous evil" (5:13)! But even this curmudgeonly Preacher has something positive on the topic of money to share. "All to whom God gives wealth and possessions and whom He enables to enjoy them, and to accept their lot and find enjoyment in their toil — this is the gift of God. For they will scarcely brood over the days of their lives because God keeps them occupied with the joy of their hearts." God-given joy... especially joy from ordinary activity seen in the light of vocations gifted by God... offers even this "tell-it-like-it-is" proclaimer of God's Word a reason to embrace hope.

It reminds me of a TED talk I saw online once upon a time that had a lot to say about joy. Michael Norton, who teaches at the Harvard Business school, opened his talk with the provocative statement: "Ever hear the line 'money can't buy you happiness'? That's wrong. It's how you spend your money that makes you happy." In the talk he proceeds to explain how spending money on others — not keeping it for oneself — is what makes people happy. It's giving stuff away that satisfies a deep human longing. Norton mentions a news story about people who won the lottery but now say the greed of others ruined their lives. He highlights a study at the University of British Columbia demonstrating how people who spent money on others were not only happier but performed better in their work and in their leisure activities. It all just goes to show you that the wisdom of the secular world often aligns with wisdom found in the Scriptures. Though we may at times be tempted to grab glory for ourselves, this is not where ultimate fulfillment is found.

No surprise then that true joy clinging to God's gift of everlasting life in Christ Jesus is what matters. So, why not extend last week's Stewardship Festival focus a bit? We not only take time to prayerfully consecrate our material possessions to God's mission on a response card at church. We see where God keeps us occupied: by the joy of giving life away! In Christ-Jesus our lack of trust and scarcity mindset is forgiven. God grant us all hearts that give cheerfully... and joyfully... today and always.

RLC Members Tim Hiteshew and Leah Robison, plus two volunteers from Jordan Lutheran Church, spent part of last week supporting the work of LCMS LERT by serving meals in Asheville. Working alongside volunteers from New Jersey, Alabama, Missouri, and Louisiana, they provided about 4,000 warm and hearty meals. The families coming through were so appreciative and thankful. Many still did not have running water in their homes. One woman told Tim it was the first warm meal her family has had in two weeks.

Along with the meals, LERT is also running multiple muck-out and clean-up of homes in locations around Asheville. There are opportunities available through the end of October and beyond to assist in person. St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Conover has been an awesome host for the LERT volunteers, providing sleeping space, meals, and friendly encouragement. In addition, the LCMS and other's efforts

to collect relief kits, food, water, and even coats have almost overrun the ability to distribute items out to the community.


