# From the Pastor Bethlehem and the Promise of God's "Yes" in Christ Jesus

(Luke 2:16 and 2 Corinthians 1:20)

God's "YES!" is always more earthshattering than the world's "maybe." Heaven's "YES" is always victorious over hell's "NO." Words, especially words of promise, bring life to lifeless people.

The power of promising words was chronicled ten years ago in a movie called The 33. I haven't seen it, but it was based on a book entitled Deep Down Dark that chronicled the ordeal of 33 Chilean miners trapped by a cave in during the summer of 2010. If you followed the news back then you'll remember how, after the accident at the Copiapo mine, no one knew whether or not any of the buried Chilean miners had survived the accident. They were buried 2,300 feet underground. The ordeal was



especially agonizing for the families of the "Los Treinta y Tres." Deep Down Dark talks about the experience of the families who were forced to endure weeks of not knowing the condition of their loved ones. As the days following the collapse turned into weeks, a makeshift living area sprang

up in the desert around the mine, a tent-village called Campamento Esperanza or "Camp Hope". The families of the trapped men prayed around the clock. Because of the mine's notorious history, it was originally thought that the workers had probably not survived the collapse or would starve to death before they could ever be found. But with the resources that the mining company, Codelco, was able to marshal, eight exploratory boreholes were hastily drilled. Seventeen days after the accident, on August 22, a note written in bold red letters

appeared taped to a drill bit pulled to the surface after penetrating an area believed to be accessible to the trapped workers. It read simply "Estamos bien en el refugio, los 33" (English: "We are well in the shelter, the 33 of us"). From that time forward, what many feared would be a recovery mission, turned into a rescue mission. From that time forward, the MAYBE, or at times even the NO that the miners and their families had contemplated, turned into a YES! And as Hector Tabor tells the story of the rescue, the miraculous work of engineers and government officials who pulled off a stunning rescue of these men in less than two months is a parable of hope sustained by simple words... We are well in the shelter, the 33 of us.

St. Paul once wrote to the Christian church in Corinth that "all the promises of God find their 'YES' in [Jesus]" (2 Cor. 1:20). That is what we celebrate again this Christmas. The story of Jesus' birth, life, death and resurrection are words that sustain us when life experiences assail us and cause us to question or doubt God's love for us. Into the deep darkness of a Bethlehem night, a child — our Savior Jesus — was born! It was not a foregone conclusion that all would end well for those who waited on God's time and God's recovery mission for the human race got underway! On the Day we find ourselves above ground and living in the new heaven and new earth we will fully appreciate the love that went into that rescue effort! Advent gives us the chance to watch the story unfold again right now. We know how it ends. That makes all the difference.

Join us this month as God shines the light of His "YES" into our hearts once again.

**Camp Linn Haven** is located in Avery County, North Carolina. Its mission is to provide a wholesome, safe Christian vacation setting for persons of all ages and abilities, offer opportunities to combine the camping experience with worship and devotional activities, and to encourage fellowship through the many and varied recreational activities offered by the camp. **Orphan Grain Train** is a Christian volunteer network that ships donated food, clothing, medical, and other needed items to people in 71 different countries including the United States. This group worked with Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Asheville to distribute needed items for people affected by Hurricane Helene. The aid provided included 29,000 pounds of purchased food, generators, heaters, a 5,300-gallon water tanker truck to help with the water shortage and many other disaster relief items. 

# **Blue Christmas**

December brings a new theme as we look at how Stephen Ministers help support people who may be experiencing life challenges. This month, we focus on a "Blue Christmas." If you've never heard of it, then maybe you know the Elvis Presley song. Feel free to sign along:

> "I'll have a blue Christmas without you I'll be so blue just thinking about you Decorations of red on a green Christmas tree Won't be the same, dear, if you're not here with me."

Many people who have lost a loved one this year – or even several years ago – may experience a "blue Christmas" that extends from Thanksgiving through New Year's Day. The holiday season is a time of "thanks" and "joy" and "hope" and "family" and "new beginnings". But some experience the



opposite as they remember a lost loved one and reminisce on holidays gone by. The "hustle and bustle" of this time of year may cause some to feel uncomfortable being around others or sharing their grief.

If you know someone who may be experiencing a "blue Christmas" then your RLC Stephen Ministry team wants to encourage you to share a message of hope by saying (or hearing), "It's OK that you are not OK."

One of the songs we may sing over the Christmas season is #359 in the LSB: "Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming." For those experiencing a "blue Christmas", hear the words (or sing along again) from verses 3 and 4:

"This flow'r, whose fragrance tender With sweetness fills the air, Dispels with glorious splendor The darkness everywhere. True man, yet very God, From sin and death He saves us And lightens ev'ry load. O Savior, child of Mary, Who felt our human woe; O Savior, King of glory, Who dost our weakness know: Bring us at length we pray To the bright courts of heaven, And to the endless day."

Stephen Ministry is a great resource to those experiencing the loss of a loved one. It isn't designed to replace professionally trained grief counselors, but we are well-equipped to support people during challenging times in life. Stephen Ministers are called "Care Givers" but we know that only Christ is the "Cure Giver". It is through Christ's relationship with us that Stephen Ministers can be that safe space for people to express their grief. It is our "ministry of presence" and sometimes all a person needs to know is that they are not alone.
