Pastor's Corner for January 26-February 1, 2025

Be with God (Nehemiah 8:1-10)

If Jesus asked to take you out for lunch, would you take Him up on the offer? I'm willing to bet most of us would! I know it's a silly question, but it can be fun to ponder. Where would you take Him to eat (let's assume He's paying!)? What would you want to talk with Him about? Would you sit and listen or throw every imaginable question His way? Would you take Him to a public place, so everyone could see you with the Savior of the world, or would you chose a quiet little bistro with no distractions? Would you take time planning your outfit or rush out of the house in a frantic hurry of excitement? Would you hesitate, wondering if His invitation was really meant for you?

Someday, we will get to sit around a table and actually, physically, talk with Jesus. And not just Jesus, but talk with all the saints, from Adam and Eve, to Abraham, to Moses, to Mary and Joseph, Peter and Paul, to all the unnamed saints of God that He has written in His Book of Life! Someday, we will be gathered together in the unimaginable beauty of the Kingdom of God and hear untold stories, sing unsung songs, and live in the eternally joyful presence of our loving God. What a glorious day that will be!

So why wait? Why wait to hear the stories? Why wait to sing the songs? Why wait to listen to the Savior of the world? Why wait to be with God?

God wants to be with you now, not just on the Last Day when we are all gathered together in our eternal home. God knows that we need His presence. We need to hear from Him and see Him at work in our lives, so He gives us a way to be with Him. The same way that He has revealed Himself to His people since the beginning. He gives us His Word.

It was that Word that the people of God gathered around to become one people (Nehemiah 8:1). It was the Word of God that is the "joy of the Lord" that strengthens our hearts (Nehemiah 8:10). It is the Word of God that shows us God because the Word is God and God is the Word. There is no other written word that holds such power. Sure, there are other words that move our emotions and gather us with other people, but no other word can stir our souls and show us the God of the universe, the risen Savior of the world. There is no other word that can speak the miracle of forgiveness and life into our hearts. There is no other word that can raise the dead.

Don't wait for eternity to be with God. Pick up your Bible and be with God now. Start anywhere in the Bible. Start at Genesis or Matthew. Read the Psalms or Paul's letters. Read the histories of the Old Testament or the prophets. Start anywhere you are drawn to but simply start. Read the Word, be with God, and see Him work!


Mites for Missions

News from the Human Care Committee

- Many thanks to the congregation for their generous donations to the Advent
 Offerings. A little over \$2,500 was collected. This amount was rounded up
 with discretionary funds to \$3,000 to be equally divided between Camp Linn
 Haven and Orphan Grain Train.
- Our Christmas Store collection of toys was a huge success! Over 300 toys
 were collected and delivered to United Church in Apex (formerly New
 Horizons) for distribution to families in need. This is a yearly project for us
 and them. Visit their website for more information and/or to volunteer for
 next year with the distribution day.
- Are you looking for ways to volunteer in your community? Our church membership represents many areas of Wake County. The following groups need volunteers to help alleviate food insecurity, aid in financial crisis situations, and provide heat to low-income families.
- CARY: Dorcas Ministries provides financial and food assistance, job and career training, community resources and more to Cary residents. Volunteers are needed in the thrift shop and in the food pantry. Learn more at dorcasnc.org.
- APEX: Western Wake Crisis Ministry (WWCM) has merged with Dorcas
 Ministries to become a stronger advocate for those who are in financial, food
 and/or housing crisis. This organization provides assistance to the residents
 of Apex, Holly Springs, Fuquay Varina, Friendship, and New Hill. There is a
 collection bin under the coat rack to collect food donations for their food
 pantry at RLC. For more information, wwcm.org.

NOTE: **WWCM** does not accept donations of household items or clothes, therefore, we do not accept those items in the RLC collection bin.

 RALEIGH: Inter-Faith Food Shuttle's mission statement reads, "To feed our neighbors, teach self-sufficiency and grow healthy foods by cultivating innovative approaches to end hunger." Volunteers are needed in their pantry and gardens, and to deliver food. This group administers the BackPack Buddies program which sends food home with food insecure school children on the weekends. - WAKE COUNTY: Warmth for Wake is administered by Wake County
 Health and Human Services. Volunteers are needed to cut, split and deliver
 wood every other Saturday morning from October through March.
 Volunteers must be at least 15 years old. This program also accepts
 donations of new or lightly used space heaters, as well as financial donations.

- WAKE COUNTY: Duke Energy Share the Light Fund is administered by
 Duke Energy and accepts financial donations. Customers can apply directly

"We Want You" RLC Stephen Ministry Leaders

January's Stephen Ministry theme is a recruiting message. We are looking for people who have a desire to help people and be a part of our "ministry of presence." If you would like to join the Resurrection Stephen Ministry team, keep reading. If you're not sure, keep reading. If you're pretty sure you this isn't for you, keep reading anyway.

Every two years, RLC hosts a training class for new Stephen Ministers. This is our "off year", but it's never too early to be thinking about if this is something you'd like to do, so let's take a "peek behind the curtain" and see what this is all about.



I'll be honest, the training program is very time intensive. You will invest about 2-hours of a Sunday afternoon for about 20-weeks (depending on the start date and surrounding holidays). I remember when I started on a cold January afternoon thinking, "it's going to be after Easter and a warm spring day before I finish this." Yep... it sure was, but it was some of the best training I've received on how to listen to others, how to provide Christ-centered emotional and spiritual care and how to be a part of the caring community to serve others in need. People who have completed the training also say how it's improved their relationships with family members or co-workers as they apply listening and empathy to their everyday lives.



Your service as a Stephen Minister is also directly assisting the pastors at RLC. It is impossible for the pastors to visit and care for all the members of the church. They

rely on other members of the congregation, like our Stephen Ministers, to care and visit people in need. Stephen Ministry is a great example of how the different parts of the body work together, centered on Christ as the head, to love and serve one another. We do not train you to be professional grief counselors or therapists, but we will equip you to support people during challenging times in life. Are you up to the challenge? 
National Lutheran Schools Week
