Thriving in a World of Change

(Jeremiah 17:5-8)

How well do you deal with change? Over the years I've learned that in times of change, routine can be helpful. I've noticed that an unusually cold weather day usually feels better if it begins with my "happy juice" ... dark, Café Bustelo Espresso coffee. I typically don't watch a lot of news on TV, so on my way to the office or on the way home I usually enjoy listening to news podcasts. For me it's most often Morning Edition or The Daily. I'd like to believe that I don't have a sweet tooth, but lunch is always better when it's followed by—well, you know, something sweet! Every day looks a little different when you're a pastor. However, the little traditions in life help maintain the illusion that whatever comes our way we are managing change and doing so successfully.


The problem, of course, is that changes we cannot always foresee are ever present just beyond the proverbial horizon. A brief look at a Pew



Research Center report on change in 2025 points out that, despite the advantages brought by AI and other technologies, the challenge of fewer flesh-and-blood workers, tele-everything, digital propaganda/misinformation, and social isolation are likely only going to increase. And these are only the changes that

the so-called "experts" envision. It can all be a little overwhelming and intimidating.

Jeremiah has a Word from God about navigating this world of change. According to chapter 17:5-8 there are two kinds of people: (1) the

Church Council News

January 2025

The first meeting of the 2025 RLC Council was conducted on 14 January 2025, and began with a brief meeting with the Resurrection Lutheran School (RLS) Principal Robin Hester. Robin noted the replacement playground pavilion structure will be built by one of the RLS parents who owns a construction company and is now awaiting permit approval by the Town of Cary. This pavilion provides shelter for teachers and students during lunch breaks, etc. and will replace the current temporary structure which is very old and deteriorating. The school is using endowment funds to help pay for this replacement, but they are still looking for about \$13,000. Robin also asked us all to continue praying for two teachers and a student who are currently battling cancer.

During the month of February, the Council plans to meet with the Resurrection Lutheran Church (RLC) Staff to discuss the Strategic Plans Pastor Blanke has outlined for us in past Voter's Assemblies. Our time together will be led by Rev. Dr. Travis Guse, SE District Executive Director of Wellness and Coaching.

Pastor Blanke informed the Council that he and Chris Reed will be attending Chris' SMP (Specialized Ministry Pastor) Orientation February 3-6, 2025 at Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri. Installation of Chris Reed as Vicar for Resurrection Lutheran Church will take place during all four of the services of 8-9 February, 2025.

Because of all the developing needs of the Resurrection Campus, as reflected with the current Campus Maintenance Initiative, the Council is considering the next Capital Campaign. A complete assessment of the needs for the next 5-10 years will first be completed, followed by the more formal plans for a Capital Campaign much like The Next 40 Campaign. Tom Bolling will be compiling the needs during the next few weeks.

The Council is currently conducting its annual review of the Constitution, Bylaws, and Governance Documents. No immediate changes to the Constitution and Bylaws are expected, but the Council does need to complete a revision of the Governance Document it started in past Council Meetings.

Our Stephen Ministry theme for February is National Cancer Awareness Month: a time dedicated to raising awareness about cancer, supporting those affected by it, and promoting the importance of early detection and treatment. Cancer has had a profound impact on many of our church members, friends, and their families.

Our Stephen Ministers are here to offer compassionate support to cancer patients, their loved ones, and those grieving the loss of a loved one, who passed away from cancer.

Stephen Ministers are trained lay caregivers providing one-on-one, confidential care to those in need. They offer a listening ear, a caring presence, and spiritual support to help individuals navigate the emotional and spiritual challenges that come with a cancer diagnosis. Whether you are a patient, a family member, or someone who has lost a loved one to cancer, our Stephen Ministers are here to walk alongside you during this difficult time.


We encourage everyone to do early and regular screening for various types of cancer, especially if you have a family history of the disease. And if that screening, or doctor's visit, brings unexpected news, your Stephen Ministers can provide you and/or family members with emotional support and encouragement throughout the treatment decisions that must be made. Stephen Ministers can help people cope with the fear, anxiety, and uncertainty with a Christ-centered approach to keep focus on the life that Christ offers. By offering a safe space to express feelings and concerns, Stephen Ministers help patients find strength and hope.

For those grieving the loss of a loved one, Stephen Ministers can offer a comforting presence and a listening ear. We offer conversation that provides a non-judgmental space for individuals to share their feelings, memories, and struggles as they work through their grief.

Did you know that our church library has copies of "Cancer. Now What?" published by the founder of Stephen Ministry. It is written in 12-parts, so you don't need to read it from front to back to get the information you may be seeking. Check it out. And while you're at it, look at the other Stephen Ministry resources available in the library for you to borrow and return.

Cancer can be a long and difficult journey for patients and family alike. Sharing a confidential conversation with a Stephen Minister makes a difference. It is our "ministry of presence" to let people know they are not alone.

Greetings from Phnom Penh, friends at Resurrection in Cary!

With this note, we want to THANK YOU for your sacrifice, for your partnership in the Gospel, and for your trust in us as we seek to announce and demonstrate the Gospel to the people of Southeast Asia. Every prayer and financial gift are such an encouragement to us, a reminder that we are right where God wants us. We are so thankful to have served in this part of the world for 17 years, but we could never do it without those who send us and pray for us. You are a part of our team!

One of the highlights of the last few months was the <u>national youth camp</u> for over 100 participants, put on by the Cambodia Lutheran Church (CLC), our partners here. For 3 nights and 4 days, we <u>studied Scripture</u>, <u>played</u> lots of <u>games</u>, <u>sang songs</u>, and <u>worshipped</u>. Each youth was <u>gifted a Bible</u>. For many of them, it was their first personal Bible. The Bibles were provided by a team from Brookfield Lutheran Church, who also <u>helped lead</u> games and activities. What joy to see Lutheran youth from all over the country join this meaningful event!

It was a <u>busy Christmas season</u>, joining Christmas celebrations all over the country. The highlight was seeing <u>23 kids baptized</u> at one location! We also keep ourselves busy with normal routines, including <u>school for the kids</u> as well as ministry for Aimee and I: weekly <u>youth group</u>, <u>teaching the Catechism</u> in various locations throughout the country (J.P. just <u>wrapped up one cohort</u>, <u>started another weekly cohort</u>, and will start another cohort this coming weekend!) consulting with <u>human care work</u>, <u>Sunday school</u> at our local church, and <u>pastoral care</u> as the need arises.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on March 5th this year. Our congregation will be collecting **Lenten Offerings** for Inter-Faith Food Shuttle and Manna Foodbank. All money donated during the Wednesday night services will be split equally between these two organizations.

Inter-Faith Food Shuttle states their mission is, "To feed our neighbors, teach self-sufficiency, and grow healthy foods by cultivating innovative approaches to end hunger." They provide shelf stable food through their pantry, have onsite gardens and administer the BackPack Buddies program which sends food home with food insecure school children on the weekends.

Founded in 1982, Manna Foodbank is a private, not-for-profit service organization working to end food insecurity in the 16 counties of Western NC, including the Qualla Boundary. Update on Fire at Emergency Shelter Apartments:

Families Together is deeply grateful for the outpouring of tangible donations to support families affected by the recent fire. The cause of the fire has been determined to be unknown and unintentional. We remain so grateful that the families escaped, and we are focused on helping them rebuild their lives while more families with children enroll in the Families Together program. Unfortunately, despite our best efforts, we have not been able to locate one resident's emotional support cat.

The good news is that your incredible support has helped move one of the families who escaped the fire into permanent housing after signing a lease! The other three families are expected to move into permanent housing in the next few weeks as well.

At this time, <u>we are pausing our wish list requests</u> to focus on distributing these generous contributions to the families, enrolling more families in additional extended stay hotels, and planning the next steps for our emergency shelter. LCMS Youth Gathering 2025

Why do we fundraise?

Just in case you haven't heard, RLC will be sending a group of youth and adults to the 2025 LCMS Youth Gathering this July in New Orleans. We have been excitedly raising money, participating in pre-trip team building and bible studies, as well as lining up all the details.

But what is the cost of a trip like this and why do we fundraise? RLC decided long ago that investing in the youth and youth programming is super important (I fully agree)!

RLC follows a 1/3 format for this trip:

1/3 is budgeted and set aside by RLC (thank you, church)

1/3 is paid for by the families themselves (thank you, families)

1/3 is earned through fundraising (thank you, community)

The Youth Gathering costs approximately \$1,860 per participant (adult leader and youth costs are the same).

Below is a breakdown of how we come up with that number:

LCMS Registration Fees: \$400 per participant

Airfare: \$450 per participant

Lodging: \$180 per room per night

Room Average: \$400 per youth (\$540/2 people, \$360/3 people, \$270/4 people)

Matching T-Shirts: \$50 per participant

Activities: \$100 per youth

Food: \$15/breakfast, \$20/lunch, \$25/dinner (1 day=\$60, 6 days=\$360 per participant)

Transportation: \$75 per youth
The experience = PRICELESS


