
The Transfiguration of Our Lord March 2, 2025



Pastor's Corner for March 2-8, 2025

Mountaintop Experiences (Deuteronomy 34:1-12, Luke 9:28-36)

Juli and I were in California visiting our son two weeks ago. During that time, we went with him to Joshua Tree National Park... a beautiful desert spot not far from where he lives. It was a perfect day for walking around: sunny and cool. And though our walk in the desert that day took us near the park's namesake, it also gave us some memorable views of the snow-capped Mt. San Gorgonio. On the way out, we drove to Keys View. No one else wanted to climb to the top look out point, so yours truly, never able to resist getting to the top of anything on a vacation trip (a lighthouse, mountain, you name it) went all the way to the top for my "you-were-there" picture. The view was not disappointing. From there you could see Palm Springs, the Coachella Valley, and all the way to the Santa Rosa mountains stretching off into the distance.

Scrambling over rocks at the top of a mountain puts me in a frame of mind to imagine Moses atop Mt. Sinai, Mt. Nebo... and another mountain with Jesus. Moses would be the tongue-tied prophet through whom God would accomplish amazing things for His people. On Sinai Moses had been God's spokesman, delivering the revelation he received there. Yet even Moses, the one like whom "no prophet has arisen since" (Deut. 34:10) was not perfect. Moses would not be permitted to enter the Land of Promise because he had "broken faith" with God (32:51). Moses would only see the Promised Land from a distance. He would not go in. Nebo would be the place he would die and be buried. It wasn't until the moment of Jesus' transfiguration on the mountain that we find Moses, yet another sinner in need of grace, in the presence of the Son of God. Interesting, isn't it, that it was on this very mountain that Jesus brought Moses into the Promised Land he was only permitted to see from a distance? Only permitted to see from a distance, that is, until the Lord of Glory came along!

God's glory and grace is a hidden glory revealed in the Christ of God who comes down. Down to earth. Down to the darkness of human failure and brokenness. Down into the very places where people believe that God is too good for them. Jesus' downward mobility would take him all the way to the cross and tomb where the light of His glory would shine in the darkness of sin and death. That glory will be with us again this week in a mysterious way as we receive Jesus himself — hidden, yet present — in the Lord's Supper. Jesus' light shines in our darkness.

What can we do but join our prayers together again this weekend as we sing the closing words to the hymn "Beautiful Savior": "Glory and honor... praise, adoration, now and forevermore... be Thine!"?

There's no need to try to climb high to "see" God's glory up close. Jesus comes down to sinners like us, to make it real. As we get ready again for Lent, let's keep our eyes focused on the light of Jesus' Epiphany glory...





Helping Others See Clearly


