
From the Pastor

As the calendar turns to spring, I appreciate that Lent comes with this new season. The church calendar and my 2025 calendar sing a different tune this time of year. Take that literally! When the calendar turns from February to March, you begin to hear the chorus of creation singing a new song, birds, frogs, insects, children, dogs, wind, and rain. All these beautiful noises that God has designed with His incredible creativity come together in the awe-inspiring symphony of God's creation.

While that's going on outside, a different tune is sung in the church as well. Journeying into Lent, the "Alleluias" are put away for a time, songs and prayers take on a more somber and meditative tone. We remember the cross of Christ and how our sins put Him on that cross. Some of us may even take up a Lenten discipline that brings a bit of suffering into our daily life. We often associate Lenten-time with suffering, which I find just a little ironic since we often associate spring-time with joy.

There can be room for both! Remember, we are always resurrection people, the cross is empty, even during Lent. Because of the tomb is empty, we take time to focus on the cross and what it means for our daily lives. Jesus brings us into His cross when He says in Luke 9:23, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me."

The idea here is not to intentionally take up a life of suffering. Instead, it is to focus our lives on the cross of Christ, which can include suffering at times. Think for a moment on the physicality of carrying a cross. A cross is big enough that when carrying it, you need empty hands. There isn't room to carry anything else. That's the point Jesus is trying to make! As people of our crucified and risen Christ, He calls us to live wholly for and with Him. There is no time or moment in our lives that are separate from Christ. Our relationship with Him soaks into every particle and atom of the life He has gifted us.

SMP Vicar Christopher Reed Installation





Church Council News

February 2025

The February meeting of the 2025 RLC Council began with a short presentation by RLC Member Jon Bohlmann and Squadron Commander Major Witte, who are both representatives of the Civil Air Patrol of Apex, NC. This group of youth, ages 16-21, has met at Resurrection Lutheran for more than 20 years. This squadron has grown from about 30 cadets to more than 80 cadets and needed to move to a larger facility. Major Witte expressed the gratitude of this organization and presented Resurrection Lutheran Church a plaque to reflect this appreciation. The plaque now hangs in the hall by the Church Office. Though the cadets will no longer be training at Resurrection, they will still participate at the monthly Coffeehouse here at Resurrection.

A report of maintenance updates and needed repairs was presented. During the month of December, the lights and some ballasts in the Family Life Center gym were replaced. This has certainly brightened things up!

Pastor reported that he and Chris Reed completed SMP orientation in St. Louis for mentors and students during the week of 3 February. Concordia Seminary announced Chris' vicarage assignment to Resurrection Lutheran Church during their morning chapel service on February 6, 2025. Pastor Blanke will be mentoring Chris about 3 hours/week. Chris received his first class assignment and will begin his first distant class lecture on Monday, 24 February. Installation of Chris at RLC was scheduled (and completed) 8-9 February 2025.

In past years, Pastor Blanke has worked with the Church Council to develop the Resurrection Strategy of our Mission Activities. Pastor then presents this each year to the Voter's Assembly. This year, Pastor Blanke, the Council, and RLC Staff met together in February to jointly work on the 2025 Strategy as we continue to reach out to those near and far. Rev. Dr. Travis Guse (LCMS Southeastern District Director of Wellness and Coaching) moderated this strategy session.

The financial report reflected the annual "dip" in giving we see each year at this time. For details, please see the report provided in RCB or the paper copy available to view in the narthex outside the sanctuary. As always, your continued prayerful contributions to the General Fund are encouraged as we work together to continue the Lord's Mission Work here at Resurrection and beyond.

Stephen Ministry

You're Not Alone

You know how to dial 911 in case of an emergency. Did you know there is a separate number for someone experiencing a crisis that they need help addressing, or someone contemplating suicide but is not to the decision point to make it an "immediate 911" type of call? For help in any type of personal crisis, you can dial 988 and reach the National Suicide and Crisis Hotline. For our monthly Stephen Ministry theme this month, we want you to know that if you or someone you know is experiencing a life crisis, you are not alone.

Stephen Ministers are trained lay caregivers providing one-on-one, confidential care to those in need. While we are not trained to replace professional counselors, we are trained to recognize when someone's needs go beyond our ability to provide a listening ear and caring presence. Sometimes we do need professional care and that is where the Crisis Hotline can assist, especially if you don't know where to turn.

Here's what you can expect if you dial 988: You'll hear a message that gives you service selection options. Hold music will play while you are connected to a counselor based on your previous selection. A counselor will introduce themselves and ask if you're safe. They will continue to listen to you, understand how your problem is affecting you, provide support, and share any resources that may be helpful. Counselors have access to a network of over 200 centers across the country. It is a confidential call, and geolocation is not activated (meaning the hotline cannot tell where you are calling from, unlike when you dial 911 and you need responders to know your location).

If you are connected with a professional counselor and decide to continue working with them, Stephen

Ministers are still available for you and can work in conjunction with a trained counselor to provide another contact for confidential conversations.

Stephen Ministry is a Christ-centered ministry, and we recognize Christ as the "Curegiver". Christ knows the hurts and pains that affect us while we're in this body. But we, as the body of Christ, can also come together to support you or someone you love through those hurts and pains of this world. We are in this life together... you are NOT alone.


