

# From the Pastor That Time of the (Church) Year

(Acts 2:29-33)

It's that time of year in North Carolina that summer has not quite arrived, but we know it's on its way. NBA conference finals are almost over. Fireflies in the backyard have not yet given way to cicadas. It's still a little too cool for that swimming pool. But never fear summer's around the corner!

What is "that time of year" when it comes to the Church Year? Perhaps it's customary for us to notice the changing of the church year at its beginning... when Advent gets underway in late November. But noticing the time of year as we approach the middle can give us an appreciation



of that green growing season of the church year often called "Ordinary Time" or "Time of the Church." We move from a series of festival Sundays focused on important events in the life of Jesus to a time of year that we apply the teachings of Jesus to the Church. The color for this

season is green. It's a reminder that the teachings of Jesus that both call sinners to repentance AND give them the assurance of sins forgiven is where life-giving growth, by the power of the Holy Spirit, is found! Peter's sermon on the first Christian Pentecost mentions how the crucified, risen, and now ascended Jesus had just poured out the Holy Spirit on the people gathered together that day in Jerusalem. And Jesus still grows the faith of His people — you and me — by gifting us with His Holy Spirit, through God's Word and Sacrament.

# Pastoral Update

# **Expanding Ministries – Pastor Alan**

In January this year, I met with President Harmon about professional development opportunities as an SMP Pastor, specifically about intentional interim ministry. The Synod trains pastors as intentional interims (or "transitional interim ministers") and then asks them to serve temporarily in churches where conflict or some other "disruption" necessitates a transitional interim for a limited time – typically 12-18 months – while the church prepares to call a new pastor. He asked me in January if I would ever consider taking an intentional interim position at Peace Lutheran in Goldsboro, NC. At first, I told him "no" because I couldn't see myself commuting to Goldsboro every day; however, the church changed their call to part-time (3 days per week) and so I wrote him back and said if the current pastor being interviewed returned the call to Goldsboro then I would leave it to his discernment since I was not yet trained as a transitional interim. I did, however, commit to begin the training that started in May and runs through October.

Some weeks later, I learned the pastor had returned the call and President Harmon had given my name to the church council as a possible interim pastor. Pastor Blanke took it to the RLC Council for discussion, and they agreed to allow me to expand my service to Goldsboro.

In good Lutheran fashion you might be asking, "what does this mean?" First, there is no change to my call at RLC. I am still your Assistant Pastor and will focus my time on Wednesdays at the church and doing home visits. Next, Goldsboro is not a "call" or a "vacancy", but rather an "addendum" to my current call here at RLC.



I will serve Goldsboro three Sundays per month and two additional days during the week. One Sunday per month I will be worshipping at RLC with you. Lastly, it is only through God's blessing at RLC that we have the pastoral flexibility to assist other churches in our region like Peace Lutheran in Goldsboro who has been in vacancy now for 7-years. My focus will be to help them build education opportunities like Confirmation class, children's church and first communion; connect and outreach to the community, especially the military community at Seymour Johnson Air Base; and create Word and Sacrament stability on Sundays and home

visits for the next 18 months. In about 9-months, they will again enter the call process for a new pastor and by policy, I cannot be someone they request to fill the position after this interim period is completed.

I would like to thank Pastor Jonathan, Pastor Zach, and the RLC Council Members for their support in this decision. And I would like to especially thank you all for your prayers and support as I continue to listen to how God is working in and through my ministry.

# **Mission Minute**

Did you know that Resurrection Lutheran Church supports LCMS International Missionaries J.P. and Aimee Cima? The Rev. Dr. J.P. and Aimee Cima, along with their children (Celeste, 18; Bella, 15; and Isaac, 8), have served in southeast Asia for more than 17 years.

Currently based in Phnom Penh, Cambodia, J.P. serves the Cambodia Lutheran Church (CLC), growing collection of Lutheran congregations. He travels throughout Cambodia to equip and empower the leaders of the CLC with informal mentorship and formal theological education, that they might boldly announce and demonstrate the Gospel to the people of Cambodia.

In her role as regional coordinator of care and development, Aimee fosters holistic care for missionaries and their families in Asia, so that they can serve with longevity. The rest of J.P. and Aimee's time is spent learning the Khmer language and whizzing around on motorbikes with their children.

In May, two significant milestones were celebrated by the family: J.P. graduated from his PhD program at Concordia Seminary and their daughter Celeste graduated from the Logos International School with a high school diploma.

# **Divorce – A Sad Reality**

Have you or a family member been affected by divorce? If so, you can understand the sense of loss it can bring to everyone in the family. More than just the couple who are separating but children, parents, friends and coworkers are all affected when a couple separates. It can be a soul crushing experience that leaves a person brokenhearted. The hardest part is feeling isolated and alone during a painful time and often throws a person into a state of crisis.

Lawyers are good resources for the legal aspects of divorce, but they do not always focus their care on the emotional and/or spiritual care of the individual, taking time to listen to their pain and suffering. This is where

a Stephen Minister can provide a listening ear and help provide a person with a chance to look at possible resources to help them heal so they know that they don't have to feel alone. Today, the statistics say that 40% - 50% of marriages end in divorce AND that it takes one year of healing for every 5 years of marriage. That's pretty staggering!

If you or someone you know who could use a listening partner for support before, during or after the divorce process, consider emailing the Stephen Leader team at <u>stephenministry@rlcary.org</u> and ask about how to make a referral to a Stephen Minister.


There are other programs that can provide support in addition to a Stephen Minister, such as Pastor Alan's Christian Conciliation team and a new program that RLC will soon start called "DivorceCare."

DivorceCare is a program that provides a safe place where caring people come alongside each other to find healing from the pain of separation or divorce. In this 13-week video-based support group program, participants will find helpful counsel to manage the emotional turmoil and practical tools for decision-making so they can begin the healing process.

Resurrection will be starting a DivorceCare group in October to provide support, during or after a divorce.
