Pastor's Corner for July 20-26, 2025

Leaning on Jesus (Luke 10:38-42)

Anxiety in our country is a big deal. A quick Google search will tell you that over 21% of adults (that's about 42.5 million people) are affected by anxiety disorders in America. Maybe you struggle with anxiety. If you don't, I can guarantee that someone you know and love does. Anxiety is a big deal that matters. As Christians, what do we do about anxiety? How do we live with it and how can we support others who struggle with anxiety?

By no means will I claim to have answers to questions like this. I don't want to be naïve and simply say that praying harder or reading your Bible more, will make your anxiety disappear. That would be insulting and misleading to those who struggle with anxiety, as well as misrepresenting our loving God. In the same way that God that cares enough to provide for our daily needs of food and drink, clothing and home, God cares enough to provide for us in our anxieties.

Maybe the best Bible story that has to do with anxiety is the story of Martha and Mary. Whether you know the story or not, stop reading this and go read the story in Luke 10:38-42. Did you read it? Good, welcome back!

Usually when we read this story we are told to be like Mary and not Martha, but most of us feel like Martha. We feel "anxious and troubled about many things", all we must do in life, all the evil and hate in the world, all the hurt and pain in our families. If you're familiar with the phrase, "running around like a chicken with its head cut off" that's exactly how we feel at times. Panicked, anxious, rushed, and hurting. Then we hear Jesus speak to Martha as if scolding her for her anxiety and troubles. But is He actually scolding her?

Why is Jesus at Mary and Martha's home in the first place? Because "Martha welcomed Him into her house." Even in anxiety and trouble, Martha knows Jesus is important and necessary in her life. She gets distracted by the anxieties and troubles of the world which pull her away from her loving Savior. And Jesus knows this. He does not scold her for her anxiety and troubles, He acknowledges the reality of how difficult, even impossible it is to live with anxieties and troubles on our own. So, He gives Martha the simple reminder that He is in her house. He is with her in the midst of her anxieties and troubles and Jesus is with you in your anxieties and troubles too.

We all have anxieties and troubles in this world. Jesus knows this and He does not ignore it. As children of the Heavenly Father, He provides the Savior of the world living in your house to talk, listen, and sit with as you lean on Him and His love.

Associate Professor of
Exegetical Theology

Dr. Kevin Golden is associate professor of Exegetical Theology, dean of Theological Research and Publication, and director of Resident Field Education at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. He joined the faculty in 2021.

Golden's research experience includes Hosea, biblical usage of the divine name, Genesis 6-9, Jonah, the Book of the Twelve (Minor Prophets) and biblical intertextuality.

He is the author of Blessed Be His Name: Revealing the Sacred Names of God (Concordia Publishing House, 2021), God's Own Son Is Born A Child (Concordia Publishing House, 2019) and LifeLight: Minor Prophets (Concordia Publishing House, 2009). He contributed to the festschrift, The Mercy of God in the Cross of Christ: Essays on Mercy in Honor of Glenn Merritt (LCMS, 2016).
