Scripture Lesson

1 Corinthians 8:1-13 [Pew Bible page 931 of the New Testament]

Now concerning food sacrificed to idols: we know that "all of us possess knowledge." Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up. ²Anyone who claims to know something does not yet have the necessary knowledge; ³but anyone who loves God is known by him.

⁴Hence, as to the eating of food offered to idols, we know that "no idol in the world really exists," and that "there is no God but one." ⁵Indeed, even though there may be so-called gods in heaven or on earth—as in fact there are many gods and many lords— ⁶yet for us there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist.

It is not everyone, however, who has this knowledge. Since some have become so accustomed to idols until now, they still think of the food they eat as food offered to an idol; and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. "Food will not bring us close to God." We are no worse off if we do not eat, and no better off if we do. But take care that this liberty of yours does not somehow become a stumbling block to the weak. For if others see you, who possess knowledge, eating in the temple of an idol, might they not, since their conscience is weak, be encouraged to the point of eating food sacrificed to idols? So by your knowledge those weak believers for whom Christ died are destroyed. But when you thus sin against members of your family, and wound their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ. Therefore, if food is a cause of their falling, I will never eat meat, so that I may not cause one of them to fall.

Rev. Melissa Walker-Luckett has been a member of Royal Lane since 1986. Royal Lane ordained her to the gospel ministry in 1989. She is a Certified Educator with the ACPE, The Standard for Spiritual Care and Education, and served on the ACPE Board of Directors from 2012 to 2022, as Chair 2021-2022. She completed her ACPE certification while a Chaplain at Baylor Institute for Rehabilitation where she served the patients, families, and staff during her twelve years with Baylor Health Care System (now Baylor Scott & White Health). Melissa holds a Master of Divinity from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth and a BA in Religion from Ouachita Baptist University in

Arkadelphia, Arkansas. The Alliance of Baptists endorsed her as a Chaplain in 2001. (Her prior endorsement had been with the Southern Baptist Home Mission Board.)

Melissa trained as a Chaplain immediately after seminary at Arkansas Children's Hospital, then at Children's Medical Center Dallas, Methodist Medical Center Dallas, and worked as a chaplain for VITAS hospice for five years. She managed the Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) program at VA North Texas Health Care System in south Dallas prior to becoming Manager of CPE Programs at Children's Health, Children's Medical Center Dallas.

Melissa retired from employment to volunteer leadership with ACPE and is the incoming treasurer for the Journal of Pastor Care Publications. (JPCP)

In addition to being an avid reader, Melissa enjoys travel with her husband, Jamie Luckett, and being with her children and five grandchildren, her pets and vegetable gardening in the Spring and Summer, and western and swing dancing.

In 2015, Melissa completed The Writer's Path at SMU. She looks forward to more dedicated time to writing in coming years.
