This Date in History

Are you confident enough about your convictions that you would be willing to say them in front of everyone? Today is a good day to think about that. June 25, 1530, is the day Lutheran reformers gave public witness to what they were teaching before the emperor and the Roman Catholic church.

Dr. Martin Luther and other teachers had protested that certain important teachings of the church were not based on the Bible. Some in the church labeled them heretics that should be outlawed. But at Augsburg, Germany, they publicly showed that what they were teaching was in fact what the Bible teaches and what the early Christians believed. Their statement of faith is called to this day the Augsburg Confession, and it simply and clearly outlines how Lutherans teach the Christian faith.
