
# THE NEXT STEP

## THE NEXT STEP

It is exciting to see our congregation take the next step to enhance our gospel ministry!

When the church addition is complete sometime early in 2026, we will welcome members and guests into a spacious gathering area, enjoy being "one family" before and after our traditional and contemporary services, and have our children attending Kids Club with us in the same building as worship and Bible study. The Bridge will have a permanent home, a space available for many other uses throughout the week.

Our "next step" at school will be starting shortly with the addition of four classrooms. We hope to dedicate the school addition this summer and use these new rooms beginning in August 2025.



Thank you for your generous gifts to the Building Fund. We have received nearly \$2.2 million in Building Fund gifts. Our goal is a \$3 million downpayment by this fall on our \$10 million expansion.
