

- 1. Springtime and Jesus have something in common. Jesus' grace shines on us and things happen! The springtime sun comes out and things happen! Cause and effect! Do you have a favorite effect of springtime...or maybe a least favorite?
- 2. Read the message text (John 15:1-8) and look at the message outline to remind you of the message.a. What was memorable from the message? Share it with the group.
 - b. What question did the message raise in your mind? Discuss it as a group.
- 3. Read Acts 4:32-37. Sometimes when Christians discuss these passages, the conversation devolves into a debate. "Should we try to recreate this situation?" "Is this a model for society?" Let's avoid all that. Take a deep breath and just appreciate these verses. What is happening here? Why are people doing what they're doing? (see the end of vs 33 especially)

Just as God's grace was powerfully at work among the church to help people then, God's grace is powerfully at work among us, too. St. Paul's and the Bridge assists many individuals and organizations in our community. By doing so, we praise God for his grace and we show his love to those around us. - 4. Read Acts 5:1-11. The action of giving some but not all of the money wasn't the real problem. Doing something that was mutually beneficial for the poor and for the donor wasn't the real problem. The real problem was this thought: "I can hide my motives from God." Why is that thought untrue? Why is it such a serious problem? How can we avoid such a serious problem?
- 5. Back in Acts 4:36 and 37, we are introduced to Barnabas. But that's actually his nick name. God gave him such a great spiritual gift of encouragement that people called him "Encourager"! Is there an Encourager in your life? How about a Comforter or a Helper or a Leader or a Peacemaker or a Mercy-shower? Take a moment to discuss and appreciate that God has given people in your life and maybe even in your group amazing spiritual gifts.
