OPEN FORUMS AND ANNUAL VOTERS' MEETING

Be Informed – Suggest Improvements – Learn from Others

Next weekend we begin holding a series of open forums to prepare for our annual voters' meeting on May 22.

WHY ATTEND AN OPEN FORUM?

- 1) **Be Informed:** Ours is a multifaceted ministry, touching the lives of hundreds of children and adults every week with new facilities being planned and new staff coming on board. Come, learn, and ask questions about our ministry.
- 2) **Suggest improvements:** St. Paul's is a family of women, men, and children—all gifted to serve Christ in their unique ways. Open forums give our Ministry Board members and other congregational leaders an opportunity to listen to a great variety of voices within our congregation as they make recommendations to the Voters' Assembly.
- 3) **Learn from Others:** St. Paul's respects the Wisconsin Synod's practice that men exercise spiritual headship by serving as voting members of the congregation. That should not mean that men as voters are the only ones involved in the decision-making process. An individual's vote should not represent their personal opinion, but what they prayerfully consider is best for the congregation as a whole. To do that, we have to listen and learn from others. Open forums provide voters with an opportunity to listen, especially to women in the congregation, so that everyone's perspectives are included in our decision-making process.

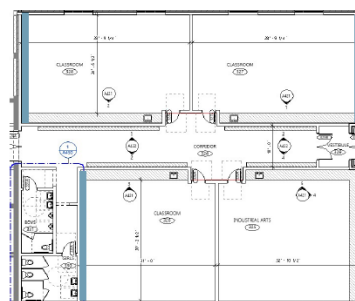

PASTOR CALL NEWS

REV. KEITH SCHLEIS CALLED TO BE PASTOR OF DISCIPLESHIP



On Wednesday evening, the St. Paul's Voters' Assembly called Pastor Keith Schleis to serve as our Pastor of Discipleship. This call is part of our process of succession planning as both Pastors Kuehl and Panitzke approach their retirement in the years ahead. Because of the number of pastoral vacancies in the synod we may need to call a dozen or more times for this position to be filled. If Pastor Schleis accepts the call, we will enjoy more than a year of overlap between the time of his arrival and Pastor Kuehl's retirement in October 2025.

Pastor Schleis is 39 years old, a 2011 graduate of Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary. He is married to Dawn. They have three children (12, 9, 6). He began his ministry at St. Paul's in Menomonie, Wisconsin. In 2015 he was called to Abiding Faith in Smyrna, Tennessee. Abiding Savior is a congregation of 192 members with an average worship attendance of 125. This school year he is also the supervising pastor for Vicar Nathan Wranovsky, a son of St. Paul's members, Steve and Amy Wranovsky.

GOD'S GENEROUS PEOPLE

WISH LIST ITEMS

The Ministerial Team approves Wish List items that are not essentials to our ministry and so are not part of our Ministry Financial Plan but are important as we carry out our mission: *By every possible means we bring every person within our area of influence closer to Christ.* The generous people of God here at St. Paul's are often looking for special projects to support. Below are our current wish list items:

- **Sports:** Replace the Centennial Gym side wall backboard to improve the practice experience for our youth. Cost \$4,500.
- **Child Care Center:** Purchase new outside toys for our children. Toys range from \$75 to \$150. Total gift requested: \$1,500.
- **Mission Trips:** Help cover the cost of mission trips taken by our members at Wisconsin Lutheran High School. The total cost of the trips is \$6,400. We have received \$875.
- **Tuition Grants:** Martin Luther College offers a matching grant for tuition up to \$1,450 for each of our students studying for public ministry at the college. To make full use of this matching grant and provide nearly \$3,000 in tuition assistance to our future called workers, we need \$10,050. So far we have received \$1,600.
- **The Bridge MKE:** Part of our funding plan for our satellite site was the giving of special gifts. In the last two years since we purchased the site, we have received \$48,408 in special gifts and offerings.
- **The Bridge MKE Lighthouse Youth Center:** For those wishing to support Lighthouse, scan the QR code to find a Wish List of items to improve its campus.
