- M Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting; but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised.
- C Honor her for all that her hands have done, and let her works bring her praise" (10, 11, 28, 30).
- M We give thanks this day for mothers who nurtured and cared for us in the past.
- C We give thanks this day for mothers who are caring for the next generation.
- M We give thanks for the godly women the Lord will bring into the lives of our children and grandchildren who will bless generations yet to come.
- C We arise and call them blessed. The women who fear the LORD are to be praised. Amen.
- Yet sin mars every relationship. That is especially clear in the home. We fail to give each other the honor and love God demands. We take for granted the loving care that others provide.
 Acts of kindness are ruined by bitterness and resentment. Therefore, let us acknowledge our sinfulness and ask God to forgive us.
- All Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior, Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.
- M God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit.



In this meal we also express our fellowship with each other, that is, that we are united in a common confession of faith. We at St. Paul's want everyone to enjoy this fellowship meal. However, we cannot ask someone to express agreement with us until we give that person an opportunity to discover what we teach. That is why we schedule frequent membership classes to provide an overview of our teachings.
