ONE FAMILY

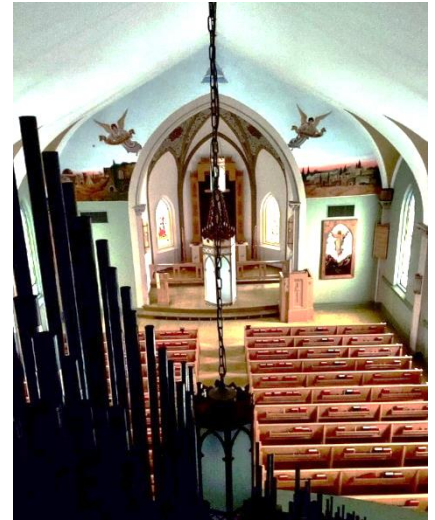

WORSHIP SCHEDULE THE WEEKEND OF JULY 21

We will still have our Thursday 6:30 pm, Saturday 5:00 pm, and Sunday 8:00 am services. We will not have The Bridge on the Muskego campus so that we can unite as one family of God for the 9:30 am Decommissioning Service. The only 10:30 am Bridge service will be at our MKE campus, 3203 S. 76th Street. The Bridge will be livestreamed from our MKE campus.



DECOMMISSIONING SERVICE – JULY 21 AT 9:30 AM

At the 9:30 am service on July 21, all four of our pastors will offer short devotions on the four Christian life events celebrated for 73 years in our 1905 church building: Baptisms, Confirmations, Weddings, and Funerals. A video memory of the building will be shown in the service followed by the Decommissioning Ceremony. The ceremony is based on a letter by the late Pastor Robert J. Zink, the last pastor to serve in the 1905 church building.

A FINAL WALK THROUGH AND RINGING OF THE BELL

After the July 21 9:30 am Decommissioning Service, the congregation is invited to walk through the 1905 church building, ringing the bell as you enter as your personal offering of thanksgiving for the ministry that took place there. The building will also be open Wednesday, July 24, 6:00 – 7:00 pm, for those who are not able to be present on July 21.

More information about mementos and how we will make them available will be published at the Decommissioning Service.

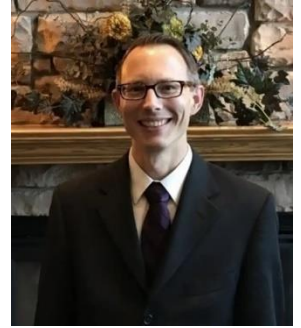
SELF-RECORDED VIDEOS

SCHOOL AIDE OPENINGS

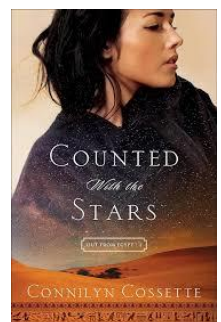
