BECAUSE IT MATTERS BUILDING UPDATE

Within the next two weeks we expect construction equipment to begin to appear on our campus. A large part of the parking lot in front of the church will be fenced off as a construction zone and we will not be able to use the main entrance to the church. When that happens, we will open the west wing Community Counseling and Care Center entrance for access for church activities during the week. For Saturday and Sunday worship services, both the west wing counseling center door and the east wing Child Care Center door will be open.

Once the main entrance to the church is closed, we will begin the Grace Room Bible study just a few minutes late to allow late arriving worshippers to enter through the Grace Room without disrupting the study. In the next few weeks, we will also see the Tess Corners Fire Department having a controlled practice burn of the duplex on the east side of our campus. This duplex needs to be removed to provide a large enough water detention basin to slow rainwater from leaving our site. Construction on the school addition will begin later this fall.
