- M In the beginning was the Word,
- C and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning.
- M Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made.
- C In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind.
- M The light shines in the darkness,
- C and the darkness has not overcome it.

The Light has Come into the Darkness of Our Hearts (1 John 1:1-3)

- M The Apostle John testifies: That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched—this we proclaim concerning the Word of life.
- C The life appeared; we have seen it and testify to it, and we proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and has appeared to us.
- M We proclaim to you what we have seen and heard, so that you also may have fellowship with us.
- C And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ.

The Light Shall Come Again (Revelation 19:6-8)

- M The Apostle John heard what seemed to be the roar of a large crowd or the roar of many waters or the sound of loud rumblings of thunder, saying:
- C "Alleluia! For the Lord our God, the Almighty, reigns.
- M Let us rejoice and be glad and give him glory, because the wedding of the Lamb has come."
- M His bride has made herself ready, and she was given bright, clean, fine linen to wear.
- C In fact, the fine linen is the "not guilty" verdicts pronounced on us, his saints.
- M Christ is risen!
- C He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

THE LIGHT OVERCOMES THE DISCIPLES' DARKNESS OF DOUBT

We begin our service here, in the darkness of doubt. What happened to the body of Jesus? The women didn't know at first. Peter and John didn't know. There was doubt at the empty tomb. Why? Because they did not understand the Scriptures.

FIRST LESSON

John 20:1-9, Bible page 926

v. 1 I know that my Redeemer lives; What comfort this sweet sentence gives! He lives, he lives, who once was dead; He lives, my ever-living Head!

THE LIGHT OVERCOMES OUR DARKNESS OF DOUBT

What comfort it is to know that Jesus lives. But what if you aren't sure. What if you have doubts about the reality of this event? The Apostle Paul wanted to remove that doubt by reminding us of the witnesses.

SECOND LESSON

1 Corinthians 15:1-8, Bible page 1154

Why is it so important to know that Jesus rose from the dead? It is the seal and guarantee that our sins are forgiven.

THIRD LESSON

1 Corinthians 15:14-20, Bible page 1154

- M "Jesus was delivered over to death for our sins
- C and was raised to life for our justification" (Romans 4:25).
- M Satan wants us to think that no one else has sinned so grievously as we have. In this way, he can trap us in the darkness of despair. The reality is that we are alike.
- C "There is no one righteous, not even one... there is no one who does good, not even one... All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God" (Romans 3).
- M We are not alone in this struggle with Satan. Christ has risen and is at the right hand of God, interceding for us. Therefore, let us confess our sins to God and to each other and claim the victory over sin and despair that Jesus won for us at the cross and the empty tomb.
- C I confess to God Almighty, before the whole company of heaven, and to you, my brothers and sisters,

that I have sinned in thought, word, and deed,

by what I have done and by what I have left undone.

Therefore I pray God Almighty to have mercy on me, forgive me all my sins, and bring me to everlasting life.

A moment of silence for reflection and personal confession.

- M God Almighty has had mercy on you and has given his only Son as the atoning sacrifice for your sins. It is my privilege to remind you that Jesus was raised to life for your justification. You are forgiven. Since we have been justified through faith,
- C we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ
- M Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.
- C In all things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. Amen. Alleluia!

At the Lamb's high feast we sing Praise to our victorious King, Who has washed us in the tide Flowing from his piercéd side. Alleluia! - M We confess that flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God, nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable.
- C We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed—in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet.
- M For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed.
- C For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality.
- M When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true:
- C "Death has been swallowed up in victory."
- M "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law.
- C Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.
- M Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord,
- C because we know that our labor in the Lord is not in vain.



St. Paul's - Caring for God's Redeemed People

Our pastors are experienced in sharing God's healing Word in every situation. They are willing to offer assistance through a scheduled conversation. Contact the church office (414-422-0320) if you wish to schedule a time to meet.

When the need extends beyond a spiritual conversation, members of St. Paul's and anyone in the community can access counseling care and services at the Community Counseling and Care Center here on the St. Paul's campus. Clinical services are provided on



site by Christian Family Solutions (CFS), a well-respected agency that specializes in counseling care and mental health treatment services. Pastor Jeffrey Bonack and Amanda Franzen are the professional counselors serving in our center. In addition to outpatient counseling, CFS provides higher levels of care to address more acute mental health conditions.

Counseling is often covered by insurance. St. Paul's also participates in the MAP program where we purchase blocks of counseling time that can be made available to those who otherwise cannot afford professional counseling. 

ST. Paul's Prepares for the Future

THE CROSS MATTERS. THE MISSION MATTERS.

Last fall God's people here at St. Paul's and The Bridge committed \$8 million in gifts over two years to provide:

- \$4 million for two years of on-going ministry here and at our second site at The Bridge MKE, 3203 S. 76th Street in Milwaukee.
- \$1 million for our mission efforts over the next two years, providing half a million to our Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod to train the next generation of church workers and to support mission work in our country and in over 40 other nations, a quarter million to support the mission of Wisconsin Lutheran High School, and a quarter million to support our mission partners and provide for facilities improvements at The Bridge MKE.
- \$3 million as a downpayment on a \$10 million facilities expansion on our Muskego campus.

PROGRESS REPORT

The Building Team has been meeting with our architects and engineers, improving, and finalizing the plans for both the church and school additions.

The church addition will include:

- a new 400-seat auditorium that will provide a permanent location for The Bridge, our contemporary service. This auditorium will be a multi-use facility available for church, school and community events throughout the week.
- a large gathering space that will link our current sanctuary and this new auditorium, providing space for us to linger before and after services and mingle with people from both worship locations.
- two additional classrooms. These two classrooms plus the three childcare classrooms will be used by our Sunday morning Kids Club, allowing families to worship and join in Bible study in the same building.

The school addition will provide:

- four additional classrooms vitally important as we anticipate every classroom will be in use next year as we add a third 4K classroom and split 5K into two classrooms.
- additional bathrooms.
- one of the new rooms will be dedicated to industrial and fine arts.

The plans also include a 20% increase in the number of parking spaces on our campus.

TIMELINE

Groundbreaking is scheduled for September 22. Our goal is to complete the school addition in time for its use for the 2025-2026 school year. The church addition will likely be done in late fall 2025.
