- M If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.
- C But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep (1 Corinthians 15:17-20).

EASTER CONFESSION

- "Do not be afraid." When the women saw the holy angel, fear was their natural response. Fear has been the human response in the presence of holiness ever since Adam and Eve fell into sin in the Garden of Eden. Today we celebrate that Easter removes our reason for fear. As the Apostle Paul declared in Romans 4:
- C Jesus was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification (Romans 4:25).
- M Jesus' resurrection is God's announcement to us that his death on the cross was sufficient payment for all our sins, no matter what we have done. We need not be afraid. We need not hide our sin. As the Book of Proverbs declares:
- C Whoever conceals their sins does not prosper, but the one who confesses and renounces them finds mercy (Proverbs 28:13).
- M Let us, therefore, confess our sins and find mercy in the death and resurrection of Jesus our Savior.
- All Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful, and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior, Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.
- M God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son (†) and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Christ is risen. My sins are forgiven. This I believe; therefore, I say, "Amen."
- M In the peace of forgiveness, let us praise the Lord.

Isaiah 25:6-9, Bible page 702

In the Old Testament, people went up the mountain to Jerusalem to worship.

Today we "go up" to worship in God's Church.

Luke 24:1-12, Bible page 1060

"He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you."

EASTER CONFESSION OF FAITH

1 Corinthians 15 and John 11

- M The Apostle Paul wrote to the Christians in Corinth to assure them of the certainty of Jesus' resurrection. May his testimony give us Easter confidence.
 - Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance:
- C that Christ died for our sins as the Scriptures foretold, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day as the Scriptures foretold, and that he appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom were still living when Paul wrote, though some had fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, and last of all he appeared to Paul also.
- M Jesus once told Martha: "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" We respond with Martha in Easter confidence:
- C Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, who is to come into the world. Amen.



HELPING PARENTS BUILD STRONG CHRISTIAN FAMILIES



- Each of us, with hands lifted high in praise, walking away from the cross, bringing this good news of forgiveness to others. The Mission Matters.


The Holy Spirit worked conviction in our hearts and led us a family of believers to make two-year commitment:

- \$4 million for two years of on-going ministry here and at our second site at The Bridge MKE, 3203 S. 76th Street in Milwaukee.
- \$1 million over two years to provide half a million dollars to our Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod to train the next generation of church workers and to support mission work in our country and in over 40 other nations, a quarter million to support the mission of Wisconsin Lutheran High School, and a quarter million to support our mission partners.
- \$3 million as a downpayment on a \$10 million facilities expansion on our Muskego campus.

THE FUTURE MATTERS

We are excited for future ministry in our expanded facilities that are scheduled to be completed in early 2026:

- a 400-seat auditorium used Sundays for The Bridge, our contemporary service, and available for church, school and community events throughout the week.
- a large gathering space that will link our current sanctuary and this new auditorium, providing space for us to enjoy time linger before and after services and mingle with people from both worship locations.
- two additional classrooms both to benefit the Child Care Center and to enable us to have Sunday Kids Club for 3K to 5th grade in the same building as worship.



The school addition, scheduled to be completed in August 2025, will add four classrooms, including one designed for art and industrial arts for our electives like woodworking, small engine repair, and sewing.

The plan also includes a 20% increase in the number of parking spaces on our campus.
