Announcing All Saints' New Website

For the past several months, Father Tony and I, and more recently Chris Scharbo, have been working with ShareFaith, a cloud-based digital media platform that allows us to manage our website, media, church management, giving and live-streaming in one place.

It was a monumental project that changed the technology of literally everything we do as a church. We thank the Endowment Board and the Vestry for supporting the cost of this project.

Last week we launched the website, and I would like to share some of the details of what it provides. If you have not done so already, I invite you to visit allsaintsjensenbeach.org and look around.

The primary purpose of any website is to speak to first time visitors. A secondary, yet important, purpose is to support repeat visitors and members as they navigate the site and engage with our church. It is in this latter respect that you will discover many enhancements to our website.

At the top of the Homepage, you will see a red bar with five buttons that link to frequently visited pages on the website. These are the This Sunday, Request a Prayer, Calendar, Cemetery and Contact Us pages.

This Sunday is a completely new page and is where members and visitors can go to gather information about our upcoming Sunday services. There are details about service times and Sunday School, as well as links to the Sunday Bulletin – typically updated on Friday – and to our live-streaming platforms. You

will note that in addition to watching services on our YouTube channel and Facebook page, you can now watch each service directly from the website on the Watch Live page.

One of the primary motivations in switching to ShareFaith's platform is the ability to automate and digitize much of what we currently do manually. So, for example, rather than calling the office to make a prayer request, you can fill in the information on the form, which still goes to Jenny in the Church Office. Likewise, you will shortly be able to sign up for all events at your leisure through the Calendar function on the website, rather than only on a Sunday or by calling the

Church Office. The same is true for Pledging and Giving (these forms go directly and confidentially to the Treasury team), contacting the Church Office, and anything else that used to require you to call the Office to provide information.

Back on the Homepage, the Main Menu bar has been completely reformatted. The first tab is for first time visitors and others who are new to All Saints'. For example, the First Visit page includes a Welcome Video from Father Tony, with additional information about our worship services, children's ministry, our beliefs, an online guest card, our clergy, and directions to All Saints', including a link to our campus directory and maps.

The Who We Are tab contains more detailed information about what makes us who we are, the cornerstone of our beliefs, our history, our clergy, staff and lay leadership, our campus, the cemetery, and, more generally, the Episcopal Church. Worship & Faith Events outlines information about our services and sacramental rites and pastoral offices. The Ministries tab outlines our five church purposes, as well as a detailed look at our children's ministry.

On the Event Calendar page, you can toggle between our Featured Events, which highlight our more public facing events, a list of all our events, and the full calendar. Very shortly you will be able to use this page, as well as the Featured Events section of the Homepage, to sign up and pay for various events throughout the year.

The Media tab contains the page where you can watch our live services, a video library of previous services and homilies, our news and publications page with links to The Trumpet, Bulletins and the weekly E-Blast, and a page that outlines the capabilities of our new Church App, including instructions on how to download the app. Coming soon will be a photo gallery of events organized by year and event.

Finally, the Giving tab allows anyone to give online at any time, as well as outlines the many ways parishioners and guests can give at All Saints'. The footer, which appears on every page, has links to our social media platforms, a sign up for E-Blasts, how to plan your visit, and the Contact Us page.

As you navigate throughout the website, we hope you will notice that we have lightened it

Deacon's Report

In so many ways, it has been a great year for our wonderful "church on the hill" here in Jensen Beach as we celebrate the 125th Anniversary of our building. Even more so, we celebrate our presence in the community. We all love this church. It is our home away from home where we gather weekly for worship and fellowship; it is enjoyed by our members and our community.

This is a church that gives so much to others. As your Deacon, I try to offer service not only to our church members but also to our community members who are often very much in need. As most of you probably know, we have a fund called TRUE, to help people often in dire need to pay their bills when unexpected emergencies occur. TRUE only provides a small sum, but it is money available to help neighbors facing troubling times to pay their urgent expenses—things like help with utilities or a portion of rent.

We collaborate with other community agencies in doing this. They refer to us and we refer to them. Sometimes we can also help our clients by telling them of other community agencies that may be able to further help them. Recently I referred someone who had serious medical problems with no medical coverage to Volunteers in Medicine, an agency in Stuart



which will help people in serious medical need with full medical coverage at least until they are 65 when they can get Medicare.

The services we render are often leveraged by our neighbors but are available, in an anonymous way, to those in our church community as well. Maybe you also may have a financial need that we can help you with due to unexpected financial situations.

Although TRUE is not intended for ongoing support, some people who come to us also have ongoing food needs. We provide this by referring clients to House of Hope and when possible, provide \$25 gift certificates for local grocery stores.

We are a community of love and compassion and are here to help others; even through talking;, listening to others when they may have emotional or physical problems.

I am no longer as active in Kairos as I was for over 10 years, but I attend some of their

functions as I have built up spiritual relationships with the some of the prisoners. Kairos means God's time; we offer spiritual

help to those prison to transform their lives so they can feel the love of Jesus Christ and help others to find Christ as well.

Weekly on Thursday afternoon, I have a Bible Study Group at Martin Correctional Institution "Deacon Gellert's group." Believe me there are great needs in our Correctional system that our society neglects. Florida has one of the largest prison systems in our country and very little is provided in education and rehab services. Kairos helps fill this void and the recidivism rate from those who are

active in Kairos is very low.

Peering Into the Past

On April 23, 1926, the J. and R. Lamb, Religious Memorial and Historical Art studios informed

Mr. Carroll Dunscombe.

"In explanation of the delay in answering your letter would say it was because you raise a new question in the latter part of your letter which certainly is not Mr. Lamb's understanding of your interview here. At that time Mr. Lamb said that it might be possible to find donors of your memorial windows in people who were familiar with Florida and the purpose of your church. Certainly, he did not intend to suggest the financing of the building

of the entire church.

However, he has had the matter referred to various loaning centers and in each case the answer is the same that at present Florida Real Estate is not an available asset and until matters have adjusted themselves and some of the inflation reduced, they doubt if it will be; and yet in each case they say this does not mean a criticism against your individual prospect, as other churches are being built and since your letter was received a decision in our favor has been made for the church glass at Clearwater.



If you can see your way as to how we can help you at this end, by giving us possible names of people here in New York who would be interested in the development of your church, we could have them looked up and see what success we might have on your behalf. In the meantime, retain the sketches for the glass, as we hope that progress on the church can be made."

Tickets are on sale after each Sunday service. Please come out and support the men in this fun event.






