# EASTER MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR

My Dear Friends:

What a joy it is to write to you this Easter.

Every year we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord it is not a date we simply observe on a calendar. It is an invitation to look again at the tomb and the stone that was rolled away two thousand years ago, and to ask what it all means for the way we live now.

We all arrive at Easter from different places. Some of us have had profound joy, goodwill and blessings and this season brings with it a beautiful climax. Others have carried considerable heaviness like the weight of the stone that was rolled from

the tomb. We have experienced loss of loved ones, illness, uncertainty, the weariness and stress of a difficult life, to name a few.

The two women, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary, mentioned in Matthew's Gospel who came to the tomb that resurrection morning also knew this heaviness. They came with their grief and expected finality, to say their last "Goodbyes" to Jesus' lifeless body. However, what they found far exceeded their expectations for they heard the most astonishing words in human history: "He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay" (Matthew 28:6). They saw an unbelievable empty tomb. The story they thought was over was just beginning.

My friends, it is the same for us. Whatever we encounter in life, the Easter message reminds and should cause us to realize that whenever we think something is over, it is only just beginning with God. Our grief and pain, our uncertainty, weariness, and illness, may not be erased immediately. The risen Christ, after his resurrection, still bore the marks of the nails,



which he showed his disciples. But Easter should change us, helping us to recognize that God's love for us is stronger than death, and that death and darkness do not have the final word.

I invite you this Easter, wherever you find yourself, whether you come to worship with a heart filled with joy, or with a heavy heart that is searching or filled with pain, know that Jesus welcomes you to come to him... and you are welcomed here at All Saints'. The empty tomb reminds us that new life is always possible, that we are never beyond the reach of God's grace.

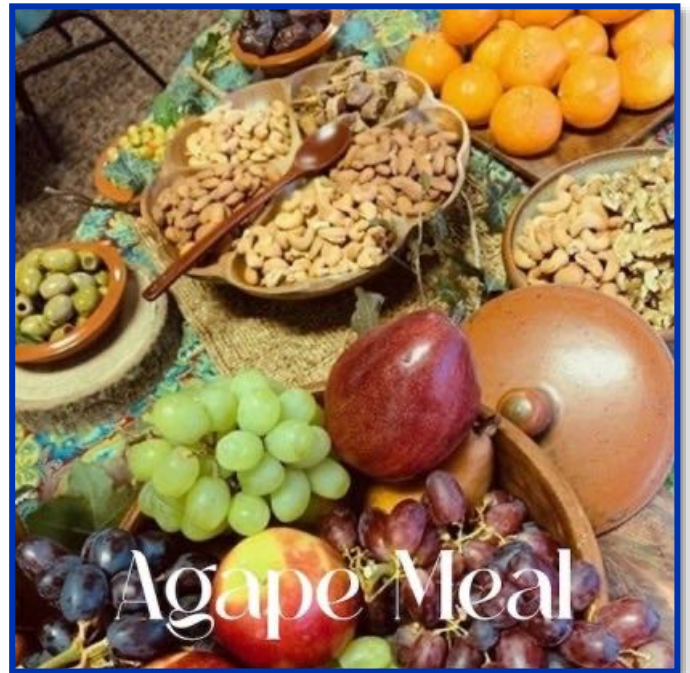
# DAUGHTERS OF THE KING

## PEERING INTO THE PAST

When you exit the church through the door that goes to the cemetery and wheelchair ramp and look toward the river you will find the two sets of stairs to nowhere. Why were they put in and when you may wonder.

The first set, with the wrought iron handrail, was put in when the church building was first moved in the 1960s. As the church was enlarged, that entry was covered up when the exterior was covered with the siding that you see today.



The second set of stairs to nowhere are closest to the river and is found below the Celeste Alvarez window today. When the church building was enlarged in the early 1990s, for fire safety reasons a door was installed in that wall space. Of course, the stairs were necessary and included for the fire safety exit. After Celeste Alvarez died, her surviving children asked to install a window in memory of their mother. The vestry approved the installation where the door had been.

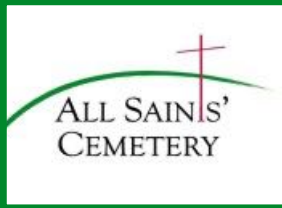
On December 5, 2011, a window was dedicated in memory of Celeste Erben Alvarez, wife of



the 4th Rector, the Rev. Frank R. Alvarez. Thus, another set of stairs to nowhere was born.

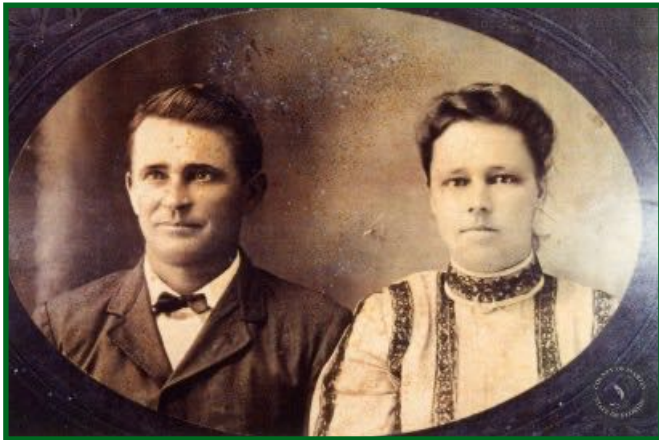

# ALL SAINTS' CEMETERY

Ransome Ren Ricou was born in Mississippi in 1867. He and his wife Gertrude (Jessie) Ross married in 1890 and moved to Eden (present day Jensen Beach) in 1894 along with their first child, Ernest Lorenzo Ricou.

In 1896, they started a commercial fishing business, R.R. Ricou and Sons. This business was grown by Ransome and his sons to be one of the largest in Florida, stretching from Jacksonville to Key West.

They purchased property in Eden from John Jensen in 1899 and built a house to accommodate their growing family. Members of this pioneering family were critical to the development of our community, employing many in the business.

Ernest also served as rural postal carrier and mayor of Jensen when it was incorporated (between 1926 and 1933).

In September of 1904, RR Ricou purchased two (2) plots, each containing 14 casket sized lots, in the All Saints' Cemetery. Sometime after that, a wall was installed around the two plots. We have not found any pictures of the wall as it first existed, nor did we know of its existence until this year.

It was recently discovered several inches below the current grade of the lawn by the cemetery staff. The wall is 42 feet by 30 feet and approximately 8 inches wide. The parts of the wall that we have found are approximately 9 inches tall, and it appears to once have had pillars on each corner and halfway between each corner.

On the east side was a ramp to allow a hand cart to enter the family plot.

The last member of the family to interred in our cemetery was Kathleen Ricou who died in 2015 and was interred in 2016.

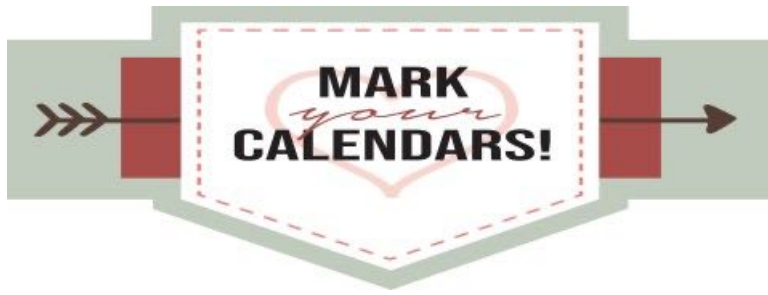

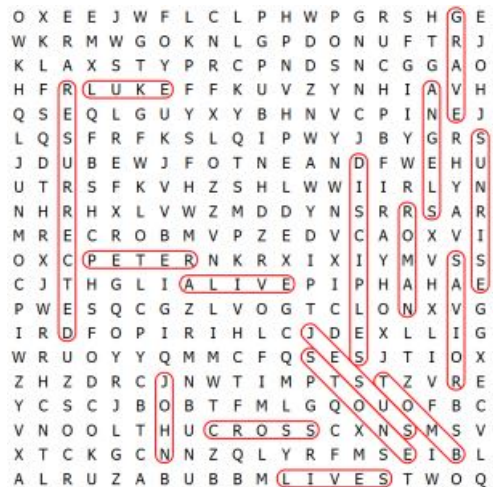

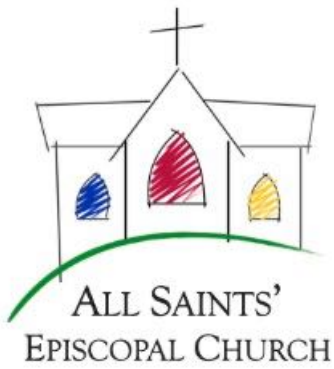
