## The Gloria

(8 a.m. only)

*The Celebrant and People say together.*

*Celebrant and People:*

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

*For the Sacrament of Baptism, after the Salutation, the Celebrant then continues*

**The First Lesson:** Acts 1:6-14

*Reader:* A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

When the apostles had come together, they asked Jesus, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away. When they had entered the city, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying, Peter, and John, and James, and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. All these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers.

## Psalm 68:1-10, 33-36

*(Page 676 of the Book of Common Prayer or as printed in the bulletin. We will read the psalm alternatively by verse).*

2 **Let them vanish like smoke when the wind drives it away; as the wax melts at the fire, so let the wicked perish at the presence of God.**

## The Second Lesson: 1 Peter 4:12-14; 5:6-11

*Reader:* A reading from the First Letter of Peter.

Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal that is taking place among you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you. But rejoice insofar as you are sharing Christ's sufferings, so that you may also be glad and shout for joy when his glory is revealed. If you are reviled for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the spirit of glory, which is the Spirit of God, is resting on you.

Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, so that he may exalt you in due time. Cast all your anxiety on him, because he cares for you. Discipline yourselves, keep alert. Like a roaring lion your adversary the devil prowls around, looking for someone to devour. Resist him, steadfast in your faith, for you know that your brothers and sisters in all the world are undergoing the same kinds of suffering. And after you have suffered for a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, support, strengthen, and establish you. To him be the power forever and ever. Amen.

Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one.”

## The Nicene Creed

*The Deacon or Celebrant shall say,*

Let us reaffirm our faith in the words of the Nicene Creed.

*Celebrant and People*

**We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy**

Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

**Celebrant:** Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life.

**People:** Amen.

## Presentation and Examination of the Candidates

*The Celebrant says*

The Candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*Parents and Godparents*

**I present Nicholas Ethan, Eliot Howard, and Zariah Madison to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.**

*The Celebrant then asks the parents and godparents*

Will you be responsible for seeing that the children you present are brought up in the Christian faith and life?

*Parents &*

*Godparents:* **I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant:* Will you by your prayers and witness help these children to grow into the full stature of Christ?

*Parents &*

*Godparents:* **I will, with God's help.**

*Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the parents and Godparents who speak on behalf of the children.*

*Celebrant:* Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

*Answer:* **I renounce them.**

*Celebrant:* Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

*Answer:* **I renounce them.**

*Celebrant:* Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

*Answer:* **I renounce them.**

*Celebrant:* Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

*Answer:* **I do.**

*Celebrant:* Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

*Answer:* **I do.**

*Celebrant:* Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

*Answer:* **I do.**

*The Celebrant then addresses the congregation, saying*

*People:* Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support *these persons* in *their* life in Christ?  
**We will.**

*The Celebrant then says these or similar words*

Let us join with *those* who *are* committing *themselves* to Christ and review our own baptismal covenant.

## **The Baptismal Covenant**

*Celebrant:* Do you believe in God the Father?

*People:* **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

*Celebrant:* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

*People:* **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

*Celebrant:* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

*People:* **I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

*Celebrant:* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of the bread, and in the prayers?

*People:* **I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant:* Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

*People:* **I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant:* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

*People:* **I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant:* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

*People:* **I will, with God's help.**

## **Prayers for the Candidates**

*The Celebrant then says to the congregation*

Let us now pray for *these children* who *are* to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

*A Person appointed leads the following petitions*

*Leader:* Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

*People:* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader:* Open their heart to your grace and truth.

*People:* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader:* Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

*People:* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader:* Keep them in the faith and communion of your holy church.

*People:* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader:* Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit.

*People:* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader:* Send them into the world in witness to your love.

*People:* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Leader:* Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory.

*People:* Lord, hear our prayer.

*The Celebrant says*

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and forever.

*People:* Amen.

## **Thanksgiving over the Water**

*The Celebrant blesses the water, first saying*

The Lord be with you.

*People:* And also with you.

*Celebrant:* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*People:* It is right to give him thanks and praise.

*Celebrant* We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*At the following words, the Celebrant touches the water*

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever.

*People:* Amen.

# The Baptism

*The candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant, who then immerses, or pours water upon, the candidate, saying*

Nicholas Ethan / Eliot Howard / Zariah Madison / I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

*When this action has been completed for the candidates, the Celebrant prays over them, saying*

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

**People:** Amen.

*Then the Celebrant marks on the foreheads the sign of the cross [using Chrism if desired] and saying*

Nicholas/ Eliot/ and Zariah, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

**People:** Amen.

## The Lighting of the Baptismal Candle

*The Celebrant may give a lighted candle to the parents or Godparents.*

**Celebrant:** God has rescued us from the power of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of His beloved Son. Receive this light and walk as a child of the light.

**People:** Let your light so shine among people, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.

**Celebrant:** Let us welcome the newly baptized.

**Celebrant and People**

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

## The Peace

*The people stand for the greeting of the Peace.*

*The Celebrant says to the people*

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

**People:** And also with you.

## The Announcements

*The people sit for the Announcements.*



# The Great Thanksgiving

The people remain standing. The Celebrant faces them and sings or says

## The Consecration Prayer

*The people may kneel or stand, as desired, during the Eucharistic Prayer.*

*Then the Celebrant continues*

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

***Celebrant and People:***

**We remember his death. We proclaim his resurrection. We await his coming in glory.**

*The Celebrant continues*

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with [ \_\_\_\_\_ and] all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

***People:*** Amen.

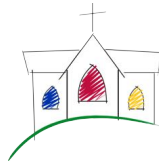
