A CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR

The Shepherds, an Example of How God Reveals Himself to Us

My Dear Friends:

Despite the hustle and bustle of the holidays, the month of December is meant to be a season of preparation and reflection, a time to spend in quietness and anticipation.

We are meant to be taking it easy, not turning it up a few notches and yet that is what we allow the world to do to us. We tend to live at the world's pace rather than at the tempo God would rather us experience. And yet, over 2,000 years ago, the pace was somewhat like now. People were hustling and bustling as a census was commanded by the emperor that the whole world needed to be

registered. People were scrambling to get to their hometowns to be numbered among the citizens.

Joseph, the soon-to-be earthly father of the unborn child who would become the Messiah, the Savior, of the world, had to travel with his pregnant wife, Mary, from Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, and on to Bethlehem, because he was a descendent from the house and family of David. It was so busy that even all the inns were filled and people like the Holy Family had to be turned away. Even the king's life was so busy that he too did not know that a greater king than he was born. Yes, life was busy back then around that first Christmas, and it is still the same today.

But not everyone was hustling and bustling.

The shepherds, for example, were in the fields keeping watch over their flock, both day and night. They were lying on the ground, keeping warm and hoping that no animals would attack their sheep nor one of the sheep would wander away from the flock and get lost, which meant that they would have to go in search of it. They were just quietly doing what shepherds did in the middle of the night.

What the Christmas story shows us is when we are hustling and bustling, we often miss what God is revealing to us, what he is saying to us. The people who were busily hustling and bustling missed the moment when the Christ Child was born even though it took place in their midst. No one in Bethlehem knew what was taking place. It would be the visit of the wise men at the Epiphany that the people, even King Herod, would realize what had happened.

However, the shepherds were the ones to whom the good news was told that the Child was born, and they were given the location where they would find him. They were the ones who heard the angels singing, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!" (Luke 2:14). It was the shepherds who were not caught up in the busyness of the world that knew when the birth occurred and were there to witness it. It was the shepherds, in the quietness of the fields, to whom God revealed what was taking place. The shepherds give us the example of how God reveals himself to us.

My friends, we will get caught up in the hustle and bustle, the busyness, of life. It is part of human nature. But we also need to take time to spend in quietness with God. Those are the moments when God speaks to us; those are the moments when God reveals himself to us. If we are always busy, hustling and bustling, having no time to spend in solitude with God, we will miss out on what God desires to reveal to us both individually and communally. Hopefully this Christmas and into the new year you will make that change to spend more time in serenity with God.


May you, your family, and loved ones, have a blessed Advent and a joyous Christmastide, filled with hope, peace, joy, and love.

DEACON'S REPORT



As most of you know, I have now completed 11 years as Deacon at All Saints. I was ordained on November 23, at our Cathedral in Miami after completing 3 ¹/₂ years in studying

and preparation. In my life as a deacon, I have always tried to follow what I vowed to do.

I've loved All Saints from the first time I came here to a healing service in the white church on the hill, so beautiful and friendly.

My ministry has consisted of primarily prison ministry, administering the TRUE Fund and pastoral care, which has been my primary



function even before being ordained. I feel very close to most of our congregation, and so I try to reach out to all as much as I can. Currently, my primary focus is to facilitate lay eucharistic ministry, which entails reaching out to, and visiting with, those who can't come to Church because of chronic physical health problems or other acute health issues. There are so many of us with geriatric challenges.

We all need physical healing, and I try to attend the healing service to provide this. I especially worry about our members who after many years of attending our church are unable to attend as much as they have in the past. We are such a caring Church and reach



out in support to all of those who, like me, have chronic health issues.

We are a great loving church who care about others both those who attend in need and also those in the community who have so many health and social needs. We as Episcopal Christians are a loving family who care about one another.

Fundraising

The Fundraising Team has three activities planned for the December/January time period.

First, the CHRISTMAS CARD

TREE will be available on all the Sundays of Advent, December 1, 8, 15, and 22. It will be located in the breezeway or in Houg Hall. A freewill donation will be accepted to put a card on the tree. You can use our card or



bring your own to put on the tree.

The idea is to put a card on the tree for your All Saints' Family instead of sending individual cards through the mail, thus saving postage and providing a fundraiser for the church. The cards will be available to read on the tree during Advent and the entire Christmas season.

Registration for second annual **WEIGHT LOSS CHALLENGE** will start on January 1, 2025. Cost to join the challenge will be \$20 with half going to the Church and half to the winner of the challenge. The winner will be determined by



who has lost the most weight by percentage of starting weight by March 22nd.

You can start the challenge anytime between January 1 and January 10. The challenge will end for all participants on March 22nd. We will





Creating a Multi-Purpose Space in Coffey Hall

A few months ago, we had an occasion when there were people waiting with the receptionist in

Coffey Hall to meet with Father Tony in his office, a meeting going on in the Conference Room, a family in the Cemetery Office deciding a final resting place for their parent, and another family came to the Cemetery needing to speak with the manager. Yikes. Where to put them as they wait? The only available space was the kitchen (which was busy with copier sounds) or one of the offices in the hallway, both of which are typically locked for the security of their files.


This is a good problem to have. It means that we continue to have growth and activity around our campus and that our church and its related entities are thriving.

But it was a little

uncomfortable for our guests. We talked with Father Tony last month about the situation and we all decided that if we think about the offices with a slightly different approach, we could turn the office space that is currently being used by the Historian and the TRUE Fund into a truly Multi-Purpose Space that the Church and the Cemetery could leverage when needed.

The plan is to leave the

Historian's files where they are and move the TRUE files to a locked cabinet within the closet of the room. We've removed the desk and extraneous chairs and placed the small desk left over from the remodeling done in reception against the wall, available for use, but not the primary feature of the

room. A new desk chair, a 6' round rug, a set of nesting round tables, and four reception chairs, and some stacking overflow chairs round out the planning. We plan to freshly paint the room where and add new art to the walls.

This Multi-Purpose Room will create lots of new opportunities:

• By creating a friendly reception room, we could change the dynamics of the TRUE Fund from an "interview" of a person requesting help to a "discussion" of how the church could best help a person who seeks us out. We can meet around a small table as equals instead of the True Fund Administrator sitting behind a large desk looking at the supplicants.

• By creating the reception area, it will be easy to have persons awaiting a discussion with the

Cemetery Manager or anyone else to come into the air conditioning without putting their emotions on display for other staff and visitors.

• By adding a monitor on the wall, we can create a team room. This will facilitate small team discussions and training sessions when they need privacy or do not need the size of the Conference Room.

• By keeping the desk and the historical files, the Historian and the True Fund Administrator will still have full access to complete their tasks, making the room functional for all parties.

We're excited about this change. It will take place over the next few weeks, and we'll be sure to share pictures when its completed.




PEERING INTO THE PAST

In the Annual Report for the year 1987 – Fr. Paul Bourne was the interim Rector and he reported the following:

 Rectory was converted to an office complex

 new lights, paint, phone, carpet and furnishings.



• Outreach effort of \$18,942 was spent which represented 9% of the parish budget (feeding the hungry through Jesus House of Hope (3) with money and food collection, distribution of fresh

oranges, food staples and clothing to the Victory Children's Home, Samaritan House and the Indiantown Migrant Workers, personalized birthday cakes and an Outreach Sunday Event).

• Russ Skinner was the Senior Warden. The chalice and paten used each Sunday was given in memory of his mother. He and his wife are interred in the cemetery.



The Jonathan Coffey Hall, which was once the Rectory, the home of the rector, is now an office complex housing the Church and Cemetery Offices.

- Long Range Planning and Search Committee were operating concurrently;
- Search Committee received 49 names from the Diocesan Deployment Office and an additional 15 from the Episcopal Ministry Renewal Ministries Office.

These numbers were winnowed down to one that was presented to the Vestry. He is not mentioned by name in the Annual Report.

- Celebrated Larry Crary's Ordination to the Diaconate; (1)
- Deacon Daniel Lepore 15th Anniversary of his Ordination to the Diaconate;
- Christmas Attendance 524 and Easter

It is lot of work; there may be more folks that help them do that ministry. I will have to check them out some Wednesday afternoon over in Bethany House."

Bea continued to fill Groggy in: "I know it was busy and noisy, I'm surprised you slept though it: but it was cooler so I understand. On Saturday evening and today after Mass, people came and collected the auction items they won the bid on -- after they paid for them. Misses Brinley, Sandy, Karen and Elyta were very busy. 


