Scholarship Program

PEERING INTO THE PAST

As you enter the church, on the right hand side, is a window of Noah's ark and a rainbow given in memory of Robert J Smith, 1920 -1948. Until this past week,



I was unable to find him with his parents Max and Bea Smith, former parishioner of All Saints, in a US Census. Both of them were very engaged in the parish in the 1950-1960s. I never heard any conversation about this young man.

My guess was that this son was a special needs child since I could find nothing on him- no military records, no death record. But this week, the genealogy cards fell my way and I found the following.

Robert J Smith was born July 20th, 1920 in Des

Moines IA. Having enlisted in the state of Iowa, he served during World War II, as a Private First Class in the Headquarters Company, of the 94th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron, 14th Armored Division (Cavalry) from Dec 7, 1942 - Dec 14, 1945.

The Des Moines Register informed their readers that in the early morning hours on New Year's Eve, coming home from a party, Robert's car skidded into a light pole.

At the time of his death, he was a student at the State University of Iowa and visiting with his parents.

Robert died on January 1st, 1948. On January 3rd, 1948, his funeral service was held at St. Paul's Episcopal Church and he was interred in the veterans plot at Glendale Cemetery in Des Moines, IA.

His grave is marked with a Veteran's upright marble headstone.

How wrong was I! Mystery solved. All the people in all our windows are now identified.

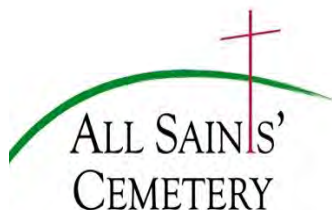

ALL SAINTS' CEMETERY



Earlier this month we welcomed the newest member to our cemetery, our Columbarium. In preparation for its arrival, the staff updated the concrete around the existing mausoleums and

for the new Columbarium pad.

Surprisingly, each concrete surround had a different color: one pale blue, one pale grey, and one pale yellow. The new stain is a pale cream color and it provides a unified platform for all of the above-ground burial locations.

The new Columbarium was delivered early January. It was amazing to see the crane haul it up and over trees and structures. We wondered how this would work, as the Columbarium is strapped to the crane. How, we asked, will you get the straps out from under the Columbarium? Our contractor let us know that they place several blocks of ICE on the concrete pad under where the Columbarium is to be placed. Then, they deliver the structure onto the concrete pad, remove the straps, and the new Columbarium settles into place as the ice melts. Clever, huh?

The new Columbarium has 72 niches for cremains and each of them is easily reached if one wants to add flowers. Come by and see it sometime!

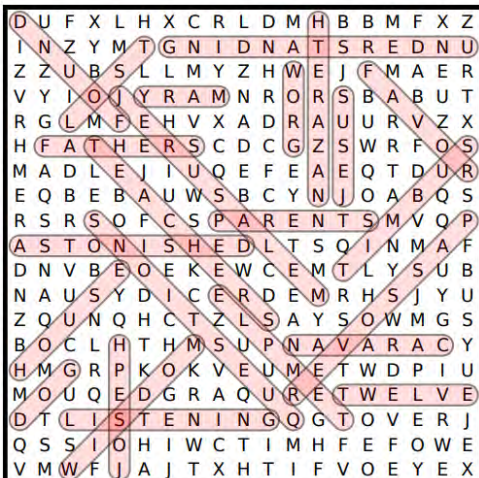
