A MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR

The 81st General Convention of the Episcopal Church

The 81st General Convention of the Episcopal Church will take place from June 23 to 28, 2024, in Louisville, Kentucky, at the Kentucky International Convention Center. The theme of the Convention is **“Together in Love.”** There is great hype among those who are attending this year’s Convention. The main reason for that is that this Convention will mark the conclusion of the nine-year ministry and primacy of the **Most Reverend Michael Bruce Curry** as the Presiding Bishop of The Episcopal Church, and the election of his successor. Presiding Bishop Curry will demit office on November 1, 2024, when the new presiding bishop will assume this position.

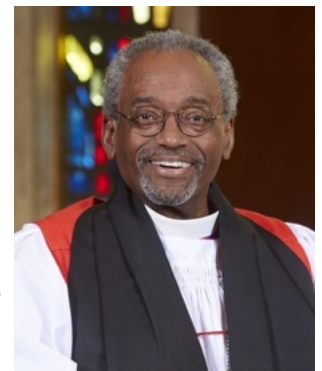


But what really is the General Convention?

The General Convention is the primary governing and legislative body of the Episcopal Church, which comprises of 108 dioceses and three (3) mission areas in 22 countries or territories. It has the authority to “amend the Constitution and Canons of The Episcopal Church; adopt a triennial budget; authorize liturgical texts and amend the Book of Common Prayer; adopt communions and covenants with other churches;” consider and adopt resolutions that influence the Church, “set qualifications for orders of ministry and officeholders; elect officers of the General Convention, the Executive Council, and members of boards; and delegate responsibilities to the interim bodies of The Episcopal Church.”

This bicameral Convention, consisting of the **House of Bishops** and the **House of Deputies** (Lay and Clergy), typically meets every three (3) years, and by an **Executive Council** during interim years. During General Convention, the two Houses meet and act separately but they must concur in order for legislation to be adopted.

All bishops of The Episcopal Church, including diocesan bishops, bishop coadjutors, suffragan bishops, both active or retired, have voice, seat, and vote in the **House of Bishops**. Its’ president is the Presiding Bishop. The House of Bishops meets regularly in a non-legislative capacity

between General Conventions to respond to the needs of the church and society. It is the House of Bishops that elects the Presiding Bishop from among the nominees. The results of the election are then reported to the House of Deputies, which then votes to confirm or not to confirm the election.

The **House of Deputies** is composed of up to four lay and four clerical deputies from each diocese or jurisdiction. Clerical deputies may be priests or deacons, while lay deputies are to be communicants in good standing. Our Diocese’s deputation at the Convention will comprise: **Clerical:** Canon Debra Maconaughey, Dean Tony Holder, Rev. Roberta Knowles, and Fr. Sanford Groff; **Lay:** Duncan Hurd, Michelle Lane, Jean Milien, and Ingrid Cheesborough. They are also four (4)

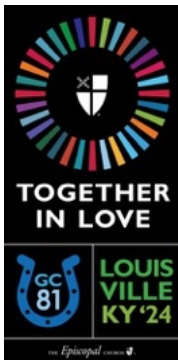

Clerical Alternates and two (2) Lay Alternates. The presiding officer of the House of Deputies is the President. At each General Convention, the House of Deputies elects or reelects a president to serve a three-year term, for up to a maximum of nine (9) years.

The **Executive Council** of The Episcopal Church, an elected body of bishops, priests, deacons, and lay leaders, carry out programs and policies adopted by General Convention and to oversee the ministry and mission of The Episcopal Church.

Other interim bodies, standing commissions, and task forces, meet regularly to study and draft policy proposals for consideration and report back to General Convention. These bodies consists of bishops, appointed by the Presiding Bishop, and priests or deacons and laypersons appointed by the President of the House of Deputies.

The Opening Service of General Convention, 1904.

The first General Convention of the Episcopal Church was held from September 27 to October 7, 1785, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The Rev. William White, who would eventually become the first President of the House of Deputies and the first Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church, was the brainchild behind having a General Convention every three years. Each state (later diocesan) conventions would elect representatives directly to the General Convention while bishops were to be democratically elected and be responsible to the General and Diocesan Conventions, and to be “servants of the Church and not its lords.”

The House of Deputies is the older of the two houses having been formed in 1785 while the House of Bishops was formed in 1789.

Deacon's Report

I have been struggling with what I want my diaconate to be as I enter my second decade of being a Deacon at All Saints'. Much of what I have been doing, I have continued doing for my entire Diaconate life here. I feel ready for a change.

After serving as administrator of the TRUE Fund for about 12 years, I have decided to resign from this role as of May 31. This is an important ministry, and I hope it will continue. In collaboration with House of Hope and the Salvation Army, we've been able to help many persons in need through the TRUE Fund.

The Fund has helped hundreds of deserving people in small but significant ways, and I will help whoever chooses to take over this worthy cause in any way I can.

I am also relinquishing my work at the prison where I have been doing Kairos Ministry for over ten years, bringing the love of Christ to those incarcerated in our state prisons. Florida has a substantial prison population, and there is a great need to show prisoners we care.

There is very little rehabilitation going on now in our prisons, and I am hopeful that more will be done to help these prison residents change their lives like so many already have. I have had a Bible Study group at Martin Correctional Institution for over ten years, but interest is dwindling, and there is much need to help prisoners develop spiritual lives for themselves.

What do I plan to do? In two words, pastoral care. Outreach to our members through Lay Eucharistic Ministers and just being available to help our members find help through the love of Jesus Christ in our Church, but also to do more evangelistic outreach, to connect to new members who come to us seeking a Christian



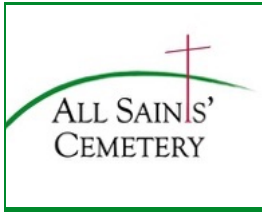
spiritual life. There is a great need to connect more closely with both new and longer-term members. I intend to be around with all of you as I have been, but in more direct pastoral ways and in the liturgy of our Church, which I love.

The Bishop and the Rector are aware of these changes I am making in my ministry and have agreed to support me in this pursuit for another year.

Many thanks to those who are supporting the fund financially already.

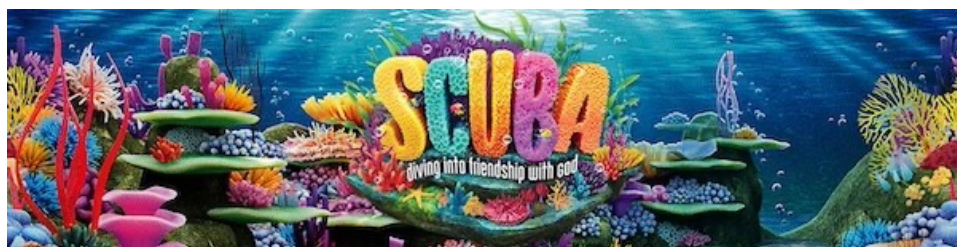

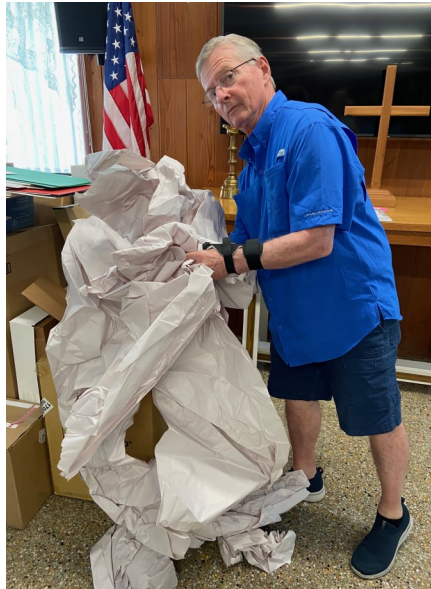

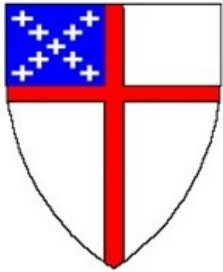
