# Pentecost Message from the Rector

My Dear Friends:

As we enter the month of May, we are just over the halfway mark of the Easter Season. We look toward its culmination on the fiftieth day, which we call the **Day of Pentecost**. Pentecost is the third most important feast day of the Church, after Easter and Christmas.

The Evangelist, Luke, reminds us in **Acts 2: 1-4**

of what happened on that day:

*“When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.”*

What took place on this first day of the Christian Pentecost was one of the most powerful moments in the history of the Church. The Holy Spirit came, like the rush of a mighty wind and as tongues of fire, and everything changed. Nothing has ever been the same since. The tongues of fire rested on each of them individually and personally even though they were in community. For the Spirit functions both communally and intimately. What we receive together as a Church, each of us receives personally. As a result, the small, frightened, grieving, group of believers who assembled in one place behind locked doors,

waiting and praying together, became a bold, Spirit-filled movement that turned the world upside down. They left that place and walked into the streets of Jerusalem unable to keep the good news to themselves. It was the birth of the Church, the beginning of the Christian movement, the Jesus movement.

The same Spirit who filled that place is alive and at work among us today. What the Spirit did to

those first early Christians, he does and continues to do to us. When we are moved by the Spirit, he turns inward people outward. He turns fear into courage, and silence into proclamation. We do so, not in our own strength, but in the strength of

a Helper – the Comforter, the Advocate, the One who guides us into all truth, the One who Jesus promised. This is still how the Spirit moves.

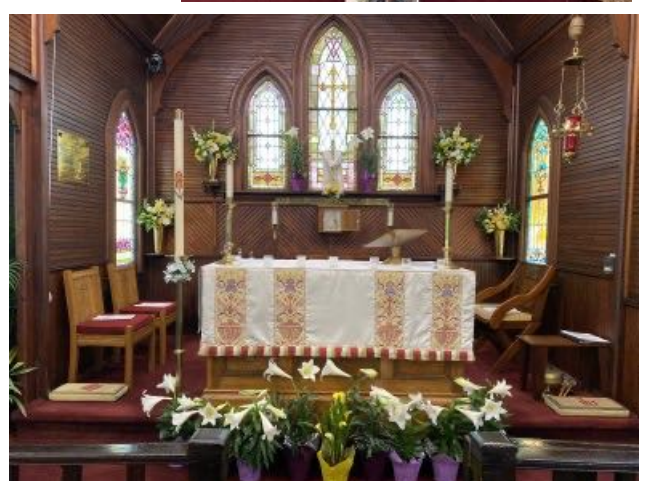
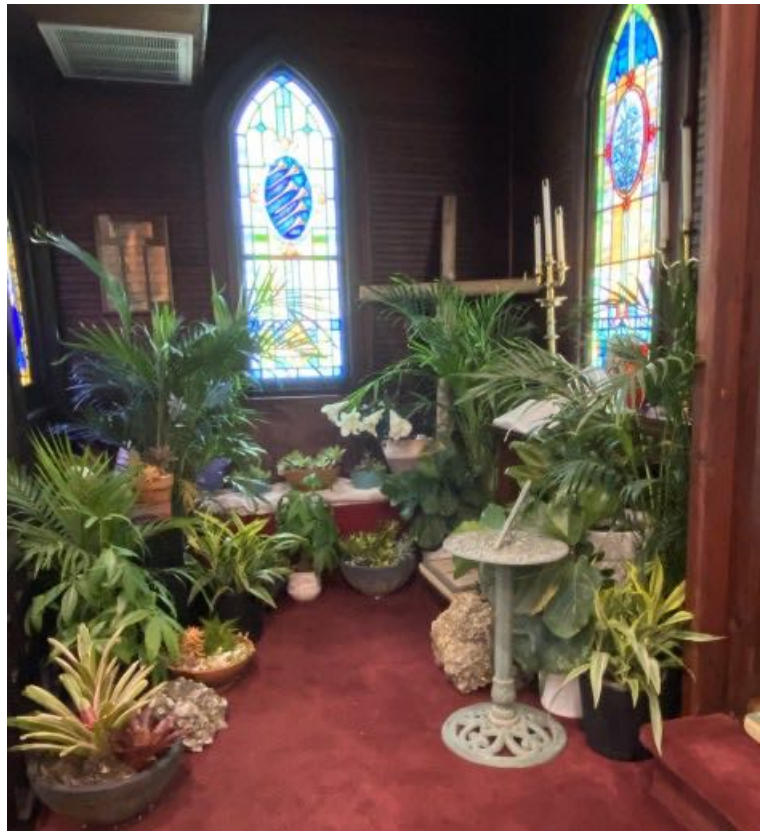

# Peering Into the Past

Barbara Miller Ferson, 85, of Jensen Beach died Friday at the residence of her daughter in Belleview, Florida.

A native of Eden and member of a pioneer family, Mrs. Ferson was a lifelong resident of St. Lucie County, teaching school for 35 years. She was a member of the Order of Eastern Star for over 50 years, and a past worthy matron of Unity Chapter No. 37 in Stuart.

Survivors include her daughter, Mrs. Betty Svec of Belleview; three sisters, including Mrs. B.D. Fulton of Stuart; two grandchildren and two great grandchildren. (1)

Funeral services will be held Monday at 2 p.m. at All Saints Episcopal Church, Jensen Beach, with the Rev. Frank Alvarez, rector of the church, officiating. Burial will follow in the All Saints Cemetery.”

In addition to teaching, she wrote the “Jensen News” column for the Stuart News and reporter for The Palm Beach Post newspaper in the 1930s. (3) When the Old Timers, pioneer family social group, resumed activity, she was elected the president for 1952-1953 (4) and served an additional two terms as president.

In June of 1973, the Fort Pierce Tribune published articles on the early history of Eden



by recording the memories of Barbara Ferson when she was 83. Her memories of life along the Indian River included

crabs, fish, plants, pineapple farming, the activities of school children, the young people and the life of pioneering families in the late 19th century and early 20th century. (5)

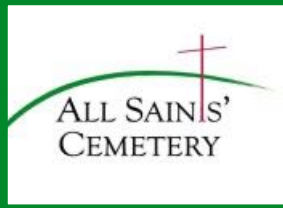
Apart from a few years as a newlywed and when she was too frail to live independently, she lived for 80 years in the house her father built.



This historic wooden house is found at what is today 12387 South Indian River Dr., in St. Lucie Co.

Construction began 1889 and ended around 1901; it started as a two-room one-story house and ended up as a ten-room two-story house with a cross-gabled roof. It is still occupied.

# ALL SAINTS' CEMETERY

I guess I'm a bit old school. Whenever I think of Memorial Day, I think of May 31<sup>st</sup>. But in 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which changed Memorial Day to the last Monday in May to create a three day weekend. This change took effect in 1971; this year, Memorial Day is on May 25<sup>th</sup>.

While most know Memorial Day is a day of remembrance, many don't know its exact history, importance, or how to properly pay tribute. "The greatest casualty is being forgotten," said Wilton Williamson Jr., Vice President of Connection at Wounded Warrior Project (WWP.) "We will never forget. Memorial Day is a time to remember and honor all of those who paid the ultimate sacrifice while serving this country." Memorial Day honors the sacrifice and loss of those who served and died in the military.

Below our cemetery's green grass many veterans are resting in peace. We have a few who died in war, still others who died as a result of injuries which occurred when they were on active duty, and of course, those who died long after their service. On Memorial Day (and on Veteran's Day) the Boy Scouts come and place flags on all veterans' graves that they can find, regardless of when they died. Veterans' graves are usually marked with a flat bronze military grave marker, which our cemetery staff work hard to ensure remains above the grass.

When you see the flags in the cemetery, please take a moment to think of these service members and honor their sacrifices. Service members, veterans, and others in the military community encourage us to spend Memorial Day thinking about the men and women who have fallen in war.

"Memorial Day is important to me because I honor those who have sacrificed their lives and their family's lives in pursuit of freedom

for our nation," said Army veteran, Edwin Martinez. "What greater gift can one man or woman sacrifice to keep the U.S. free and maintain our way of life?"

The Wounded Warrior Project encourages us to say "Have a meaningful Memorial Day" or "Today and always, I am remembering [name]" instead of "Happy Memorial Day." They also suggest we wear red poppies symbolizing remembrance and respect for those who died in service to their country.

“Be strong Flora, and please go check for me I’m curious I think this is more cars than we have ever had here for the Car Show,” Groggy responded.

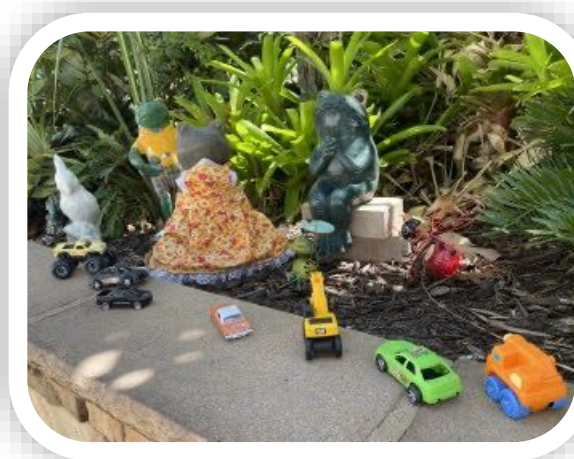
So Flora flew off and the garden critters just sat and watched the people.

"Shhhh. It's time to be quiet." Little One reminded the others. As the people gathered for church the critters were silent and very still. But they listened as folks walked by most of them saying "Good Morning" to others.

As Miss Sandy and Mr. Jack went by Jackson gave a small wave to Mr. Jack and he smiled back. Then Father Tony came across the campus – his white robe flowing out behind him.

Maybe the friends were so still they fell asleep, maybe they were all listening to the church service, and we might not ever know. However, I heard a voice when I came up the sidewalk an hour later. Little One was excited but

whispering, so I stopped to listen to our small friend.

Father was talking about Peter and the crowd around him after Jesus rose from the dead. He said that "Peter's Pentecost sermon declared that the Jesus they crucified was made both Lord and Messiah by God, and that he was the "long-awaited and promised Messiah... When the crowd heard this, and were confronted with the guilt that they had done this, they asked what they should do." Peter told them to repent so their sins would be forgiven and he charged them to turn their lives around and be true to the Gospel message. Nodding his head as he spoke, Little One repeated the message for his friends. "Then Father Tony said: Re-orient your lives and publicly identify with Christ and God will lead you in life. Be in the world but not of the world. Because that is what Christ expects of us!" (1)

I pondered that for a bit as I settled into my pew; and then I realized Little One had been preaching to me as well. By repeating parts of Father Tony's message to his garden friends, he had spoken to me as well. I chuckled and thought; 'Wait till I tell Father about that truth!'

So my friends I suggest we all take time to be still and listen, and then show the world we follow Christ by our actions and interactions with the people around us. (2) Goodbye my friends – till next month!

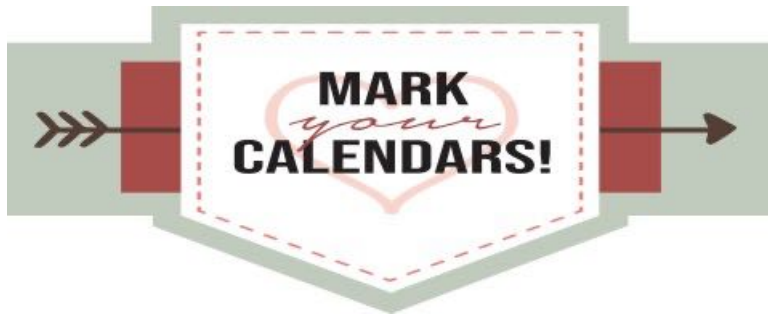

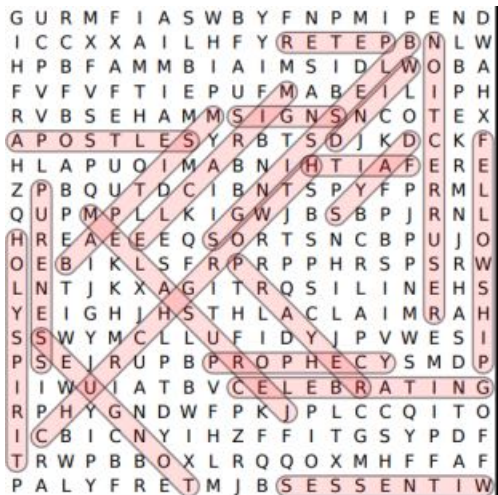
