A MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR

The new Presiding Bishop and Primate of the Episcopal Church, The Most Reverend Sean Walter Rowe

In a modest service, with just over 100 persons in attendance, **the Most Reverend Sean Walter Rowe** was invested as the new spiritual leader of the Episcopal Church. The Investiture

Service took place on Saturday, November 2, 2024 (All Souls' Day), in the Chapel of Christ our Lord, Episcopal Church Center, the headquarters of the Episcopal Church, in New York City.

Rowe officially became the Presiding Bishop and Primate of the Episcopal Church on All Saints' Day (November 1), after **The Right Reverend Michael B. Curry**, the 27th Presiding Bishop and Primate, demitted office on October 31.

During the service, Rowe received the primatial cross, the symbol of the office of the Presiding Bishop and Primate of the Episcopal Church, from Bishop Curry. Also attending the service was the 26th Presiding Bishop, **The Right Reverend**, **Katherine Jefferts Schori**, the first female to hold this position.

Normally held in the National Cathedral (The Episcopal Cathedral of St. Peter and St. Paul) in

Washington, D. C. as has been the case with previous presiding bishops, Bishop Rowe preferred a simpler service.

Previously the Bishop of Northwestern Pennsylvania (2007 - 2024), Provisional Bishop of Bethlehem (2014 -2018) and Provisional Bishop of Western New York (2019 -2024), the new Presiding Bishop was the youngest ever elected to that position at the age of 49. He is the second youngest overall since the first presiding bishop, William White, was 41 at the time he began the first of his two terms in 1789. Rowe was also the youngest Episcopal priest in the United States, 25, at the time of his ordination in 2000, and the youngest serving bishop in 2007, at the age of 32.

Just a few days (October 25 and 26, 2024) prior to becoming Presiding Bishop, at the invitation of Bishop Eaton, Rowe was the Celebrant and Preacher at our 55th Diocesan Convention Eucharist. The Convention was held on the campus of the Chapel of St. Andrew's Church and School, Boca Raton. He noted that the average Sunday attendance

laurels.

in an Episcopal congregation is 31, with a total of 350,000 people attending Sunday services in the nearly 7,000 Episcopal churches. In addition, only 20 churches have an average Sunday attendance of over 300.

It is against this backdrop that Presiding Bishop Rowe believes that significant changes need to be made. We will have to modify or do things differently going forward from how we have done it previously. Rowe focuses on organizational structure, strategy and budgets, but with a view to the gospel. He emphasized the importance of supporting the ministries of the local congregations which he called the heartbeat of the church. He lauded

former Presiding Bishop Curry for laying the groundwork of refocusing us on Jesus and being a beloved community and evangelism, on which we need to build. This will involve "a lot of experimentation," he said, "trying new things" and methods of doing ministry and church. However, he acknowledged that not everything will work, maybe not even most of it will work, but we cannot just sit back on our

He advocated for the College of Congregational Development, a program which started in the Diocese of Olympia, under the leadership of the Assisting Bishop of our Diocese, The Right Reverend Greg Rickel, when he was the Diocesan Bishop of that Diocese. This program seeks to develop congregations of all sizes, locations, and conditions into more faithful, healthy, and effective communities of faith. Already, All Saints' have signed up to be a part of that program to be held in June 2025.

We wish former Presiding Bishop Curry a healthy, relaxing, and blessed retirement, and

join in wishing

Presiding Bishop Rowe, God's blessings and guidance as he leads us, the Episcopal Church, for the next nine years.

All Saints' Cemetery

Starting Sunday, October 27th through Sunday, November 10th, the All Saints' Cemetery is promoting its 5th Annual

self-guided History Tour.

There are two self-guided tour books available this year: The local Pioneers and Notable Neighbors and Veterans who are buried in our Cemetery. The graves of these individuals are marked for the self-guided walking/driving tour. The books each cost \$15 and are available for sale at the Cemetery office building which is open from 9am to 1pm, Monday through Friday.

Cemetery Tours

For \$50, you can get a 30 minute personal tour on a golf cart of one of the topics, with historian, Joyce Fletcher Menard. Personal tours are available on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., on days when there are no funerals planned.

Sign up for a tour at the office. Proceeds of the tours go towards defraying the costs of installing security cameras around the cemetery.

The Columbarium project continues to move forward, albeit at a slower pace than we originally anticipated. The approval for the zoning passed through the Martin County Board of Commissioners on October 8th.

Our next step is to obtain final building permit approval. We are extending the Pre-Construction Sale pricing until the Columbarium is installed. Just a reminder, the Columbarium is a marble structure which has room for 72 niches.

Every niche will be at a height that one can touch and easily place or change flowers. The Columbarium is a smaller building than the existing Mausoleums and we ultimately expect to be able to place two side by side. The pre-construction pricing for the new Columbarium will continue

until delivery.

This pre-construction price is a 10% discount, \$2,160 per niche; after delivery the price will revert to \$2,400. Come see Rebecca or Joyce in the Cemetery Office, Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

As we discussed last month, the new Cemetery Website is being built.



Peering into the Past

Thirty-six years ago, All Saints' welcomed its' Sixth Rector, The Reverend Thomas F. Ryan, Jr. Father Tom would serve the people of All Saints' from 1988–2005, making him the longest serving cleric in our parish.

The following are highlights of Fr. Ryan's years of ministry with us:

1988: The Rev. Thomas F. Ryan became the 6th Rector.

1992: The Rev. Deacon Daniel Lepore resigns, having served at All Saints for 22 years.

1993: A nearby home is bought and named the St. Theresa House to expand our ministry.

1994: The church building is expanded for a second time and became wheelchair accessible. Improvements were made to Houg Hall and met ADA standards.

1997 : The Rector, the Rev. Thomas J. Ryan, Jr, celebrated the 25th Anniversary of his Ordination to the Priesthood

1998: The 100th Anniversary Celebration of the Dedication of the Church Building is held.

2004: Hurricanes Francis and Jeanne came ashore.

2005: Fr. Ryan retires, having served All Saints' longer than any other priest.

In a letter dated, "All Saints Day, 2004" to the Vestry and Wardens, on his personal letterhead Fr. Ryan wrote:

"Dear Friends,

This has been a difficult year for all of us and I so appreciate the love and generosity shown to me by this parish family. I would have preferred that my last year at All Saints' be one of great productivity and enthusiastic growth but with my illness and surgeries it has not been possible for us to move forward in a more dynamic manner. And now, after more than 16 years as your Rector and 33 years of ordained ministry, it

is time for me to leave this unique place and move on to a new phase of my life. I will retire as the Rector of All Saints Episcopal Church, Jensen

Beach, as of January 30, 2005. My last service will be the 11:00 p.m. Christmas Eve celebration.

I cannot adequately express my appreciation of the wonderful relationships Courtenay and I have enjoyed here. There have been important changes

made to our wonderful old Church and the ministries practiced here. I thank God for the opportunity offered to me as your leader, teacher, and pastor.

Courtenay and I will reside in Minneola, Florida and I feel that my returning to All Saints' for pastoral events such as baptisms, weddings, and funerals will, with rare exception, be inappropriate. A new rector will be selected in the normal diocesan guided calling process. My prayers for your search.

My love and best wishes always. In His Name, Signed "The Rev. Thomas F. Ryan, Jr."

Courtenay was the parish administrator and Fr. Ryan's wife. They never returned. Thomas F. Ryan Jr., 79, of Clermont, FL, passed away on September 8, 2016, at the Mike Conley Hospice House.




