BAPTISMS and pre-baptism classes are offered throughout the year. A person of any age may receive the sacrament of Holy Baptism.



Deacon's Report



My health has become less positive in the past month. My energy levels have lessened, but I still feel motivated to perform my diaconal vows as I can. As many of you are aware, I was in

the hospital three days in September and was diagnosed as having pneumonia and also some possible cardiac problems. As I can, I will continue to do the liturgy in all our services as I have done in the past 12 years, hardly ever missing a service both on Sundays and at the weekly healing service.

As a Deacon, my commitment is to serve the people of our church and also our community of Jensen Beach. As I become aware of persons in need, I will try to do all I can to minister to their needs, especially as a Eucharistic visitor and to help others to be Lay Eucharistic visitors as they feel motivated and receive the necessary training to do it. As I become aware of others in need and with their permission. I try to reach out to our members as needed and also to introduce myself to new members and follow up with new members as I can.

I miss doing all I have done in the past for so many years, especially helping persons seeking financial assistance who often tell me how much meeting with me has helped them by having someone to listen to their needs. Listening can sometimes be helpful even when we can not fully meet their needs. It isn't always what we can give them financially, but someone to hear their needs.

Also after doing prison volunteer work I have helped incarcerated persons to give them Christian or even other religious help. We try to bring those in prison a sense of how Christ can help them. It makes a real difference in their lives, someone who cares for them. Many of them have no families. We have a very large number of persons in prison in our state who receive very little in the way of rehabilitative service. People have identified that prisoners may get incarcerated under our society's Jim Crow-like rules of discrimination. Kairos and many volunteers who visit those in prison can make a big difference for these persons.

Peering Into the Past

The Christmas of 2017 was exciting. This was Fr. Frisby's last Christmas as the Rector, his wife was serving as the organist and Fr. Frisby's son Christopher had an accident while swinging the incense at the midnight service. The thurible (incense holder) hit one of the pew torches, and burning incense covered one-third of the front right hand side of the church building. That is why there are burn marks on the carpet... People were bringing water from the sacristy in to cover the burning incense. No one remembered there are fire extinguishers by the entrance and in the north transept, where the acolytes sit.

The vestry and the members were worried about the lack of a fire suppression system (inside sprinklers) to protect the church from burning down. Innumerable hours were put into coming up with a way to bring county water up to the church. The well water we have isn't strong enough for a fire suppression system.



Fast-forward to 2025 and this photo shows the contractor bringing up the pipes for county water. This is another huge milestone for our parish. Getting the water up our hill with the church still standing is HUGELY exciting for those of us who were here that Christmas of 2017 and for those of us who put in hours of work to find the solution. Stay tuned as the vestry moves forward. Thanks be to God!

All Saints' Cemetery



We had our first Cemetery Board meeting of the fall on September 23rd and we're gearing up for action in the cemetery. Since the



last zoning adjustment was done over 30 years ago, we have had to ask to have the zoning for the new Columbarium next to the Mausoleums to be "refreshed." The Martin County Board will meet on October 8, to give us (hopefully) final approval for us to move forward. After that, our contractor will pour the concrete slab next to the existing Mausoleums and arrange for delivery of the Columbarium, likely in late October.

As a result, we are extending our Pre-Construction pricing! Just a reminder, the Columbarium is a marble structure which has room for 72 niches. Every niche will be at a height that one can touch and easily place or change flowers. The Columbarium is a smaller building than the existing Mausoleums and we ultimately expect to be able to place two side by side.

The Pre-Construction pricing for the new Columbarium will continue until delivery which is anticipated to be around October 20, 2024. This pre-construction price is a 10% discount,

\$2,160 per niche; after delivery the price will revert to \$2,400. Come and see Rebecca or Joyce in the Cemetery Office, Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Also on the agenda for the future is the All Souls Day service which is traditionally done at dusk at the Conkling Cross overlooking the cemetery. It is a beautiful evening service.

We are also busy this fall working on a new website for the Cemetery. This will be linked to the Church website but will also be standalone website so that people who are searching for cemeteries online can easily find us. We are looking for great pictures for the website, hands placing flowers in a vase, the back of a person walking through the cemetery, an overview picture of the cemetery, a picture of the church and cemetery, etc. If you have one or wish to stage one, please send it to me at pamhurd@gmail.com. Greta decided to try and help Little One understand:

He also wanted them to have hope and believe in His triumph over death. That triumph is what brings all of us together. Remember how we welcomed the young child today and we rejoiced because of her baptism. We know that Jesus wanted us to do that to welcome the child into the family of God --Jesus' family, our family.

Okay, I guess I can understand that; but "What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Father Tony said that; I heard him! If people are to make disciples of the whole word – we have to gain the whole world, they need to know and we need to tell them. "You may have heard Father read those words, or say them; but they are words that Jesus spoke to the disciples. The meaning is you must believe in Jesus and God, and teach others; spreading the Good News to the entire world. However, you still need to be humble, denying what you want to do and instead follow Jesus' example and think of God all the time. Not following your whims or filling your mind and body with earthly treasures or and of the ah, ah, ah...the nasties." Groggy was visibly tired, his eyes were drooping and his words were coming out slower. And then he just stopped talking, and began to snuffle and snore.

Little One just sat there thinking; and then decided he needed a nap too.

Up in his tree, Draco softly said to Bea, Greta, Mother Mary & St. Francis statues: "I wonder what they would do if someone played a recording of Father's sermon. It might help Little One, and it might help all of us! Good night to all, have a good rest."

And quiet came over the Garden once more. I gave Greta her new dress – it rained so hard the other day – she was clean from that!
