

During the month of October at All Saints', there is a hive of activity and events taking place on the campus. We look forward to welcoming back our brothers and sisters from the north as they begin to return to the south.

We begin the month with the **Blessing of the Animals** in observance of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of animals and the environment on **Sunday, October 5.** Next, we

resume **Adult Bible Study** on the Book of Genesis on

Wednesday, October 8; the
Women's Fellowship's annual
Welcome Back Brunch on
Saturday, October 18; our
Annual Giving (Stewardship)
Campaign Kick Off on Sunday,
October 19, at which we will
hear inspiring testimonies from
members as to why they love
and make All Saints' their
church and spiritual home.
Musical Bingo on Friday,
October 24, is a delightful

music while playing a game of bingo. **Monday, October 27,** self-guided **Cemetery tours** begin, featuring the resting places of Sewell's Point pioneers, veterans, neighbors of note, and other pioneers. Lots of exciting activities and events will take place on our Church campus.

In addition to all that is happening at All Saints', we are a part of a **Deanery (North Palm Beach)** which stretches from Jensen Beach to West Palm Beach and as far west as Wellington, Clewiston, and the Everglades. We are a part of a **Diocese (Southeast Florida)** with a vast geographical area from Jensen Beach in the north to Key West in the south, stretching across to the middle of Florida. We are also a

part of the **Episcopal Church** which exist in 22 countries or territories, and the **Anglican Communion** comprising of 85 million people from all over the world.

This brings us to a major event in our Diocese, the **Diocesan Convention**, which takes place during October. Clerical and lay delegates of all churches in our Diocese gather for two days of worship and prayer, and to conduct diocesan business, make legislative decisions, address financial

matters, and discuss the mission and governance of the diocese. Hosted this year by the North Dade Deanery, this primary governing body will meet at Saint Andrew's Episcopal School, Boca Raton, on *Friday*, *October* 17 to *Saturday*, *October* 18, 2025.


The guest of honor will be the President of the House of Deputies of the Episcopal Church, **Julia Ayala Harris**. President Harris presides over the House of Deputies (Clerical and Lay) during the national General Convention which meets every three years. Outside of General Convention, and together with the Presiding Bishop, Julia implements policies and a strategic plan for the

Church's governing body. Elected president in 2022 and re-elected in 2024, she lives in the Diocese of Oklahoma and is a member of St. John's Episcopal Church, Norman.

President Ayala, and **Dr. Sarah Stonesifer Boylan,** who is currently the Dean of the
Stevenson School for Ministry, in the Diocese
of Central Pennsylvania, and a member of the
Board of Directors of the College of Bishops,
are expected to address the Convention.



"Welcome back, Flora. How was your adventure today?" Greta asked her new best friend. It was a warm afternoon, with a deceptively gentle breeze blowing. It was one of those afternoons when the sun shines bright, the heat builds incrementally; but big, big clouds are forming to the south. "Come on over here and visit with me for a while." The sprinkler water makes the air cooler right there and no one bothers me at all. If I pick the right one, it is also a fabulous spot to just sit and take in the view of the big body of



water below. I think that is the Indian River Lagoon. Today there are sail boats going by. They look small from up here on the hill, but if I get close to them they are pretty big."

"Thank you, I was tickled when I received it last week, this reminds me of fall colors. Flora, it is good to know you like the sprinklers too. We think the sprinklers are great, especially when it is so hot. We just sit under the spray and enjoy the shower. I think however, we will be getting some rain today. It just feels like a thunder boomer is on the way.

"A while back, someone said they thought thunder sounded like God was bowling. I didn't know what that meant. Your Aunt Bea went down to the corner and into the bowling alley to figure out what that person was talking about. She said it was a horrible noise. Big heavy balls were dropped or were thrown down a narrow wooden lane. The balls rolled quickly towards white things standing in rows just waiting to be hit. She said the worst thing was there were many balls being thrown at the same time and then some thrown one right after other. The sound of so many white things being hit and bouncing around was deafening. Bea was very happy to get out of there quickly!"

"Thank you, it is good to hear about Aunt Bea. Now, I also know that bowling alley is somewhere I don't have to explore. Not with balls being thrown around. When the children were here for VBS; I flew up near Draco to watch so I was out of their way. But I we had fun watching them." Flora smiled as she spoke about VBS.

"Hi Greta! Hi Flora! What's happening?" Little One hopped into the shady spot and joined the ladies. It looks like someone will be getting rain in a bit. Clouds are getting much darker to the south and they are HUGE! They billow up and up into the sky – I wonder if God can touch

them? Greta, do you think we have thunderstorms because God is angry at any of us? Sometimes it sounds like he is stomping around up there."

"I don't think that is why we have thunderstorms, Little One. Storms have more to do with the wind, the air pressure, and how much moisture there is in the air and clouds. I think lightening comes from the friction of the clouds and air currents as they come together; it's has something to do with an electrical charge. But I can tell you, I like watching the lightening and waiting for the boom and crashbang of the thunder. Especially when there is a separation of time between the two." "Why?" Little One asked.

"Why what?" Greta answered. "I like it because it is exciting. I like it because when there is a longer separation between the lightening and the thunder, seconds but still space in time; it means the storm center and the lightening is farther away!!! I bet you have never been under a tree when the storm is cracking right above your head. The ground shakes and the crack of the lightning and thunder happen at the same time. It is deafening. It is scary. And sometimes there is an acrid smell."

The bushes swayed as the wind rushed by them. "Uh oh, did you all feel that shift of the wind? Storm is a coming!" Groggy groaned and managed to sound the alarm. "Flora, you best stay right here with us for a while. Flying could be dangerous."

Little One quickly hopped over to Groggy and re-asked his question. "Does that mean God is angry with us?"

Groggy replied; "Little One, Greta just answered your question. So I have to ask: Have you been listening to Father's sermons on Sunday morning?" Seeing him nod, Groggy continued. Now, let's take cover that storm is getting close!" Groggy gave Little One a tiny nudge as distant thunder rolled around the heavens.
