Our objective with Kairos is to help incarcerated men learn about Christ and know that Christ loves them

and can change their whole lives. We even have table mats prepared by children to give to the men. They love these mats and can take them back to their dormitories.

We also participate in collection items for the needy. If you or your family have a specific need other than prayer, please let me know (dorothybree@mac.com)



### PEERING INTO THE PAST

Do you know where this piece of marble is in the church building? You probably would if you are a member of the Altar Guild. I've known where it was since I was a kid, but only recently did I ask Fr. Tony what it is called.

This piece of marble is called a **mensa**. According to "An Episcopal Dictionary of the Church: A User-Friendly Reference for Episcopalians" (Armentrout and Slocum, Editors), a **mensa** is a flat stone inlay that makes up part of the altar top. The **mensa**, which is normally constructed from marble, usually lies in the middle of the altar under all the linens and fabrics that cover the altar.

I am guessing that the **mensa** in our altar has been there since the beginning of All Saints'.

The term **mensa** is from the Latin

word for "table." When the church building was constructed in the 19th century, the altar was placed against the east wall with the stained glass windows. The priest stood facing the east wall while backing the congregation to celebrate the Eucharist. The Elements (the Bread and Wine) were consecrated on the mensa.

However, with the change in liturgical practices like the altar being removed from the wall, and the priest celebrates the Eucharist facing the congregation, the Elements are no longer consecrated exactly on the **mensa**.


**Notice the five crosses?** They represent the five wounds of Christ when he was pierced on the cross. Usually, there are four crosses on the corners and one in the center on the top of an altar. (Have a look at the Conklin Altar on our campus).

### ALL SAINTS' CEMETERY

Today, we are going to talk about pricing of cemetery plots and crypts. Over the last 6 years (2018 – 2024) plot prices surged by an average of 65%. Compared this to the Consumer Price Index (CPI), which increased 25% over the same time period.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, demand for graves increased significantly. With a limited supply, prices rose accordingly.

Early on, general inflation was relatively low, yet cemetery property and grave prices experienced a sharp surge.

Cemetery property prices continued to increase rapidly in subsequent years, far outpacing

inflation. This trend is still happening today.

Although cemetery property is not the same as traditional real estate, it is also a long-term, high value asset. Just like traditional real estate, grave plots are finite resources with location-based premium. They often appreciate in value over time due to scarcity and demand.

Analyzing cemetery plot price trends in both markets reveals similarities such as supply limitations and demand-driven price fluctuations.

While housing prices have leveled off in the last


few years due to higher mortgage interest rates, there has been no leveling off of plot prices.


The continued rapid growth in plot prices, even as housing markets leveled off, underscores their unique market dynamics and sustained

demand.

Several factors have contributed to the sharp rise in cemetery property and

grave prices:





- 1. **Pandemic-Driven Demand:** The COVID-19 pandemic resulted in a tragic loss of life, which led to a high demand for grave plots.
- 2. **Aging Population:** As the population ages, the demand for burial plots increases, contributing to higher prices.

- 3. **Limited Availability:** Urban areas nationwide face a shortage of space for new cemeteries or expansion. This raises land values and heightens competition for available plots.
- 4. **Rising Cemetery Costs:** Cemeteries face higher expenses for land acquisition, maintenance, and staffing. They had to pass these on in the form of higher prices to purchase new plots and endowment care.
- 5. **Regulatory Changes:** New regulations around cemetery management, land use, or environmental standards can raise operational costs, leading to price increases.
- 6. **Economic Resilience:** Cemetery property has shown stability even during periods of broader market volatility.
- 7. **Final Arrangements:** The COVID-19 pandemic heightened awareness of end-of-life planning, which in turn prompted more advanced purchases. More people than ever recognize the importance of planning for final arrangements and the wisdom of purchasing a cemetery plot or crypt of their choice ahead of time.

We've worked hard at All Saints' Cemetery to keep our pricing lower than the for-profit cemeteries in our area, but we are facing the same pressures of increased labor costs, limited land availability and reduced number of suppliers. If you are thinking of needing a plot or crypt in the future, now is a great time to invest, as the pricing will only continue to rise.

Kevin just kept smiling and hopped back to his corner of the garden; very happy to be home.




