

He is restoring the lost sheep of His kingdom from a temporal relationship that leads to death to an eternal relationship that leads to life. And in this time of the dash, our Heavenly Father wants us to know, without a doubt, that our eternal future is secured in His Son Jesus Christ for those who believe. Please join with me in this Thanksgiving season, to praise God for his mighty work of restoration

Current Financials

Please continue to pray for God's provisions. Here is the current breakdown of our finances this year from January to September 2024:

Income: \$101,715. Expenses: \$115,668. Net Total: \$ -13,953.
