

Easy Evangelism

The Lord Jesus distributes various gifts about the in Christ's body. church body. "For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. Having

gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness." (Romans 12:4-8)

While these are not exhaustive, the aforementioned gifts are given by God to carry out the task of evangelism in various ways. Some are given gifts of service or acts of mercy in which they work behind the scenes providing for the comfort and care of others, thereby showing gospel work in deeds. Some evangelize by teaching what the Bible actually says about who is Jesus, why he came, and what that means to mankind. Some are called to evangelism support by contributing generously to gospel ministries. Spiritual gifts are given to the body to make the work of the great commission not only easy but a joy. When we use God's gifts for Kingdom work, we GET to bless others, all the while we are being blessed ourselves.
