Online Church Directory

To access the directory online, go to <u>mem-</u> <u>bers.InstantChurchDirectory.com</u> and enter your email address as listed in the directory. Click on **"Send Secure Sign-In Link."** Then check your email and click on the **"Log in to Instant Church Directory"** button found in your email.

A free mobile app is also available in the **Apple® App Store** and the **Google Play™ Store.** Just search for "Instant Church Directory" to download.

Important: Your email address **must be listed** in the directory before you can log in.

If you need help getting in, come by the church office or Janine would be happy to help you after worship or at the luncheon on the 20th. Once you have created an account, you can edit your content, so feel free to use a different photo.

Mercy Ministries
