Anticipating the future begins with trusting that God has a plan. The Lord declares in Jeremiah 29:11: For I know the plans I have for you, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.

Knowing the future is according to God's plan we can then look forward with joy even in times of uncertainty. In Proverbs 23:18 we read: There is surely a future hope for you, and your hope will not be cut off.

In James 1:5 we are assured that: If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him. Reach Over

Hopefully, prayerfully, and in anticipation, in the near future we will move from mission church status to becoming organized once again. In order to organize, we need officers trained and prepared to take on the duties of governing the church. In the interim, we have been blessed with provisional elders from our



sister churches in Lake Placid, Bartow, and Lake Wales. We also have been blessed with deacons within our church body who have sacrificially continued to dedicate their time and talent to the upkeep and financial health of our church campus. Now is the time to train up our future leaders through officer training. The officer training is open to our entire church family (even if you are not currently serving in a leadership role), however only members may go on to serve as officers. We will begin by asking participants to view 6 online videos, produced by the Catawba Presbytery, and answer some short questions about each video. These can be viewed at your own pace over the next 2 months. From October through December, we will have 3 in person training sessions, the first of which will begin with a review of the video lessons. If you plan on participating in the classes, please let me (Pastor Karl) or the church office know and I will send you the training material either as an email attachment or as a handout.

In anticipation of the what the Lord will be doing, we want to be purposefully and consistently in prayer for our church. I am sending out weekly prayer emails with a specific weekly prayer focus. Additionally, Janine is sending out weekly church family prayer needs. Please use these resources to help guide you in your daily prayers.

We had our first prayer meeting on the 4th of July when many of our church family and friends gathered together for an evening of fellowship and prayer.
