


Living the Acts 2 Church: A Review

In 2022, we began the work of revitalization by looking at the early church. In Acts 2:42– 47, we see a powerful snapshot of the early church, a community alive with purpose, unity, and spiritual vitality. They devoted themselves to four foundational practices: the apostles' teaching, fellowship, the breaking of bread, and prayer. These pillars didn't just sustain them; they ignited a movement. As we reflected on this passage, we were



Apostles' Teaching

Let's stay rooted in Scripture, allowing God's Word to shape our hearts and guide our steps. Whether through Sunday messages, Bible studies, or personal devotion, every moment in the Word strengthens our foundation. The early church devoted itself to the apostles' teaching, which was rooted in



the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. This wasn't casual learning, it was transformational. Biblical teaching grounded the church in truth, protecting from false doctrine and guiding spiritual growth. Today, this means immersing ourselves in Scripture, sound preaching, and discipleship. As Paul wrote, "All Scripture is Godbreathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness" (2 Timothy 3:16). The Word is our compass. It shapes our worldview, convicts our hearts, and equips us for every

good work. Along with our worship gatherings on Sundays and other special occasions, we also particiand with one another in these practices. Being de- pate in small groups to study the Word of God together. Fellowship



Fellowship is more than friendly conversation, it's sharing life. It's showing up, supporting one another, and building relationships that reflect Christ's love. Your presence matters. Your story matters. Together, we are stronger. Fellowship in Acts wasn't just social, it was

sacrificial. Believers shared possessions, met daily, and cared for one another's needs. The Biblical word for fellowship is koinonia, which means a deep, spiritual bond rooted in Christ. It's about mutual encouragement, accountability, and love. Hebrews 10:24-25 urges us to "consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds... not giving up meeting together". Fellowship is where we grow together, heal together, and reflect the unity of the body of Christ. We gather each third Sunday after worship and share a meal together. Make it a practice to join us. Better yet, invite a friend to come join you and your brothers and sisters in Christ. We also have two fellowship groups who meet monthly to share in friendship: Caring Christian Women (women's ministry) and Men's Fellowship Breakfast. These are two great opportunities to get to know one another.

Breaking of Bread

From communion to shared meals, breaking bread reminds us of Jesus' sacrifice and our unity in Him. It's a sacred rhythm of remembrance and celebration. Every table becomes a place of grace when Christ is at the center. This pillar includes both the Lord's Supper and shared meals. It's a rhythm of remembrance and celebration. In communion, we proclaim Christ's death and anticipate His return (1 Corinthians 11:26). In shared meals, we build relationships and express hospitality, which is an essential mark of Christian love. The early church broke bread "with glad and sincere hearts", showing that joy and gratitude are central to Christian life. We serve Holy Communion as part of our regular service on the first Sunday of each month. Please remember your friends and family who do not have a church home and are missing out on this blessing.

Prayer



Prayer connects us to the heart of God. It's where we find peace, power, and purpose. As we pray together, whether in services, small groups, or quiet moments, we invite heaven to move in our midst. Prayer

was the heartbeat of the early church. It connected them to God's power, guidance, and presence. They prayed in the temple, in homes, and in crisis. Acts 4:31 shows that after prayer, "the place where they were meeting was shaken". Prayer invites the Holy Spirit, strengthens faith, and aligns us with God's will. Paul exhorts us to "pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians 5:17), because prayer is where revival begins. We have met on two occasions this year for special prayer meetings, and we want to do more. We are looking for someone who can help our church grow through prayer. This pillar is vital to the good health of our church. My appeal is this: Join me in making this church be known as the praying church. How? I don't know, but together we can figure it out.

Let's Be That Church

Just like in Acts, when we devote ourselves to these pillars, we become a church that is alive, growing, and overflowing with joy. The Lord added to the early church's number daily and He can do the same through us. Let's recommit today to these pillars not as rituals, but as rhythms of revival. May God bless you and bless First Presbyterian Church of Sebring.
