

Over the next year we will be exploring the book of Genesis. In this first book of the Bible, we see a recurring phrase: "These are the generations of..." (Genesis 2:4; 5:1; 6:1; 10:1; 11:10; 25:1; 36:1; 37:1). Each section marks a new chapter in God's unfolding story, reminding us that history is not random but a



divine lineage of faith, promise, and purpose. Just as Abraham passed on the covenant to Isaac, and Isaac and conviction. 
