HERE COMES THE BRIDE...

'TIS THE SEASON OF WEDDINGS—a perfect time to reflect upon the picture God gives of Jesus Christ, the bridegroom, and his bride without wrinkle or spot, the Church (Ephesians 5:21-33). The current preaching series, Jesus' Living Will & Testament, covers over-arching themes. Under-girding all these is faithfulness in our relationships—with God and others—year around.

FINISH WHAT YOU START BY DAN MC NERNEY

Are we losing a sense of faithfulness in our world today? Are we placing

such an enormous emphasis on short-term results and returns that we have forgotten the virtues of being faithful over longer periods of time? Is there a new ethic emerging of just getting rid of someone who is no longer useful to us; firing them is the new, expedient solution. Are people changing jobs so often these days or constantly positioning themselves for better opportunities that they have forgotten God's call on their lives to be faithful to one another? God is faithful to us. and he calls us to be faithful to him and one another. Faithfulness brings freedom and peace to our

spirits. An absence of faithfulness brings darkness, sin, and endless entanglements to our souls, every time. We are all wanting to be loved, understood, and nurtured; and no one provides that better for us than God. And in return he calls us to be faithful to him, our spouses, families, friends, co-workers, and neighbors.

At the heart of faithfulness is mercy and forgiveness. For any relationship to succeed, the parties involved must learn to forgive one another when a faithless, selfish act has occurred. After all, that is how God treats us, giving us second chances all the time. The book of Lamentations reminds us, "The faithful love of the Lord never ends! His mercies never cease. Great is his faithfulness; his mercies begin fresh each morning" (Lam. 3:22,23).

Grace is the oil for *any* relationship to function well and flourish. God loves honest hearts, and he wants us to be blessed by long-term relationships. However, he would rather have us run from him, ignore him, or even wrestle with him, than be lukewarm and not fully committed to our relationship with him. He wants us to be either hot or cold, but never tepid. Jesus said to

USA SWIMMING FOUNDATION AWARDS \$780,000 IN 2024 LEARN-TO-SWIM GRANTS FOR SWIM LESSONS

The USA Swimming Foundation, the philanthropic arm of USA Swimming, today announced its initial round of 2024 Learn-to-Swim Grant program funding. It awarded \$780,000 to 162 swim lesson providers nationwide, vetting more than 400 applications through a competitive annual review process. These funds will be distributed across 40 states to provide approximately 14,500 individuals with the opportunity to learn the lifesaving skill of water safety.

VINCE WILSON CREATIVELY MEETS
REFUGES' NEEDS FOR WORDS
AND "WHEELS"



BICYCLE BUILT FOR TWO, OR THREE, OR MORE...

Hundreds of recent West African refugees have chosen to make their homes in Lockland, OH. They typically arrive with little beyond the clothing on their backs, then endure a years-long process to secure asylum and work permits. A normal errand in this community is 1-4 miles – a long

walk but a very short bike ride.

Vince Wilson, Paul and Mary Sue Verhagens' son-in-law (Katy's husband), has been teaching the refugees English at the Metanoia Center (113 - 115 N Wayne Ave, Lockland, OH 45215). He's also providing refurbished bicycles to people in the community. This April through June, he is operating a Friday workshop where the men can come, repair their bikes with his tools, build their first bike, or help others in need. Beyond meeting transportation needs, this bicycle ministry seeks to demonstrate to these Muslim men an overwhelming sense of Christian hospitality.

Since 2007, The USA Swimming Foundation has awarded more than \$8 million in grants to help fund youth and adults *Learn-to-Swim* programs nationwide.

Youth *Learn-to-Swim* grants of \$650,000 will be distributed to 124 providers for free or reduced-cost swim lessons and impacting an estimated 12,000 children."

This is the fifth consecutive year the CHPC Swim Ministry has received the USA Swimming Foundation award. Scholarship grants and private donations allow us to say "yes" to families involved in Jesus University ballet, Whiz Kids and the "under-served" children and teens in the broader Cincinnati community. the church in Laodicea, "But since you are lukewarm water, neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth" (Revelation 3:16).

God wants us to count the costs before beginning down the road with him, no matter how long it takes. Similarly, he wants us to think deeply about our commitments in marriage or forging important relationships with friends and fellow believers before beginning a life with them. He does not want us to start something we are not ready to finish. And when we are faithful with small things, God will give us greater treasures filled with larger blessings. Jesus said to his disciples, "The master was full of praise. 'Well done, my good and faithful servant. You have been faithful in handling this small amount, so now I will give you many more responsibilities. Let's celebrate together!" (Matthew25:21).

I grew up during a time in the 1960s and '70s when individual rights and experiences were elevated to new levels of appreciation and desire. However, instead of ushering in an era filled with greater "peace and love," as was the objective, many of these so-called virtuous but often misguided pursuits gave birth to excessive individualism, self-centered lifestyles, and an



unfortunate fear of commitment which now permeates much of modern life. Today, fewer people are marrying, staying in the same jobs, or joining local community clubs, religious organizations, or activities. An increasing number of people prefer staying within the comforts of their homes and pursuing virtual activities or viewing opportunities on computers. Perhaps they are avoiding relationships that sometimes can be messy and unpredictable. Virtual activities are much easier for them. Relationships, after all, require a lot of effort. And, in the end, there's always a risk that someone might get hurt by being unfaithful. Is that a risk worth taking?

As I look back on my own life, I am extremely grateful for my Christian faith. I am grateful that my faith demands crucial decisions and commitments and provides a life of constant community for me. As a follower of Jesus, I cannot sit back and pursue life on my own terms; I can't sit comfortably in the middle ground avoiding other people, keeping all my options open while just pursuing my own interests. That is not how God works. He wants me to go in the opposite direction, forging a vibrant relationship with

him and others. He knows that commitment will give me greater freedom, not greater restriction. As things turned out, and by God's merciful grace, I am one of those people who took his time to make a lot of very important life decisions. In fact, I was spared from making a lot of poor decisions. It was not until age 27 that I decided to become a follower of Jesus, and it was not until age 40 that I married my dear wife. Sharon, and was ordained in the same summer to full-time ministry within the Presbyterian Church USA. Now these three commitments have become the cornerstones of my life on which I have been blessed to build my family and calling. God has been incredibly faithful to me. And with his help, I am trying to be equally faithful to him, my family, friends, and ministry going forward into the remaining years of my life.

I am so glad we do not have a fickle or capricious God. That would be incredibly unsettling. On the contrary, we have a most dependable, loving, and faithful God who is always there for us, and he invites us to be faithful with him and others. "Understand, therefore, that the Lord your God is indeed God. He is the faithful God who keeps his covenant for a thousand generations and lavishes his unfailing love on those who love him and obey his commands" (Deuteronomy 7:9). He is always faithful to us and wants us to be faithful to him.

DAN Mc NERNEY, Senior Associate Director with Presbyterian Frontier Fellowship (PFF), has spent the last 40 years of his life engaged in some form of international church activity. He said, "I have been blessed to have forged lasting relationships and partnerships with Christian leaders from many different cultures. I have learned that lasting cross-cultural partnerships require a lot of time, attention, humility, and a willingness to learn from past mistakes. It takes many visits cross-culturally to begin understanding what challenges and joys new friends from Uganda, Brazil, Mexico, Egypt, and Iran are experiencing and how I as an American might be able to encourage and partner with them. Frontier Fellowship places a great emphasis faithful partnerships nurtured by time and the Holy Spirit."



WASH fund raiser. 12 dogs came with their owners to be pampered.


It was wonderful having parents, students, and leaders serving side by side. We raised \$1,483 of our goal of \$1500. It was a wonderful day!!!

Recently, the Family Ministries Team premiered the new Sunday morning curriculum for children. Read about these exciting changes and invite families with children to GROW in their relationship with God.

"Grow Kids" takes kids through every major Bible story in three years. Every year, we will spend an equal amount of time in the Old and New Testaments — six months each! The Old Testament is taught chronologically over three years, while the New Testament is taught chronologically every year (but with new stories each time). At the end of three years, we start all over again! We know you want a balance between a predictable, consistent structure and

fresh innovative ideas too!

In *Grow Kids*, here's how we find that balance:

WHAT CHANGES? With kids, you never want your teaching to get boring. So, every month, you'll get a fun new series title and theme that complement that month's Bible stories! After three years, when we revisit the same stories again, the series themes will be new all over again so you can help kids rediscover the same stories in brand new ways.



WHAT STAYS THE SAME? Keeping our teaching fresh is important, but predictability is important too. That's why the core structure of our scope and sequence never changes.

You can see the whole thing in the example below!

We separate the Bible into 36 chronological topics and cycle through them all every three years. You can count on these topics, in this order, year after year.

For example:


The EARLY CHURCH – May 2024 Week 1 - Take the first step — believe in Jesus. Jesus ascends to heaven (Acts 1).

Week 2 - Take another step — pray for others. Peter and John heal a man (Acts 3).

Week 3 - Take a big step — the Holy Spirit makes us brave. Stephen stands before the Sanhedrin (Acts 6-7).

Week 4 - Don't skip this step — tell others about Jesus. Paul shares the gospel with Phillip the Ethiopian man (Acts 8).

We in CHPC's Family Ministries are excited to share this new curriculum with our church. We hope you personally participate in some way and tell children you know and those who you commit "to nurture and raise up in their Christian walk" to come experience new GROWth with Jesus.



5/12 ONE — JOHN 17:1-19


