ACKNOWLEDGEMENT, HOPE, AND PRAYER FOR THOSE STRUGGLING WITH EMOTIONAL PAIN

National Action Alliance for Suicide Prevention is encouraging people to join in the National Weekend of Prayer for Faith, Hope and Life the weekend of May 13-15. For more information go to https://theactionalliance.org/faith-hope-life/national-weekend-of-prayer.

We encourage you to be aware of and be sensitive to for those struggling with psychological/emotional pain, suicidal thoughts, suicide attempts, and a loss of a loved one by suicide or death.

THE PAIN IS REAL.

Acknowledge that some in the church and other faith communities are in deep emotional or psychological pain. This pain could be from (a) general hopelessness, mental illness (depression, anxiety, bipolar disorder, schizophrenia, etc.), trauma— either recent or in childhood— purposelessness, social isolation, meaninglessness, or thoughts of suicide; (b) the difficulty of caring for someone experiencing such pain; or (c) the loss of someone who died by suicide.

YOU ARE NOT ALONE! Emphasize that those experiencing emotional or psychological pain are not alone. This type of pain is common, even among people of deep faith. Yet, too often, we do not acknowledge that fact. At any given time, there may be many in the community experiencing deep and seemingly unbearable pain. Those in pain are surrounded by individuals in the church or faith community who care for them deeply but may not know how to

express their love and support. In addition to offering assuring those in need that members of the community are there for support, focus on the comfort offered through the eternal presence of God.

THERE IS HOPE.

Life-sustaining hope can be found through faith, through the comfort and support of others, and through the effective treatment of mental, psychological, and emotional problems. (EXCERPT FROM NATIONAL ACTION ALLIANCE FOR SUICIDE PREVENTION.)

Living Hope encourages those who may be struggling or know someone who is struggling to reach out for help for the other person and/or for yourself so you can be

ENDOWMENT FUND ENPOWERING MINISTRY OVERSEAS

The Endowment Fund at College Hill Presbyterian Church was established in 1975. The principal money in this trust account is invested, and income generated by the fund is given away in the form of annual grants. The Endowment Fund is successfully managed by an independent

investment company that reports to CHPC Trustee Administrators. This year, \$45,000 was available for grants. Praise God! Grant Guidelines: funds are to be used for missions or outreach that aid evangelism and compassion for groups or people "beyond the walls" of CHPC. The grants are for one-time expenditures, not annual budget expenses.

GRANTS FOR 2022 USE

21 ministries were supported: 3 in our neighborhood, 5 in Greater Cincinnati, 3 in the USA, and 9 overseas. This month focuses on those overseas.

OVERSEAS:

- NABILALA COMMUNITY DEVELOP-MENT PROGRAMME for a Ugandan Presbyterian couple to run an evangelistic summer camp for underserved children in their rural area.
- THE LOTUS FLOWER is an NGO (a nonprofit organization that operates independently of any government) in northern Iraq. Chris and Greg Callison work closely with the group. This year the grant will supply children's coats to a nearby Yezidi refugee camp. The Yezidi families have lived in tents since the 2014 war.
- CALL OF LOVE MINISTRIES is producing a series of discipleship videos in Arabic for Arabicspeaking seekers and new Christians.
- CAMPUS OUTREACH IN UDON THANI, Thailand, will host student training retreats during the school year and summer events for new Christians among the students.
- OUTREACH IN TURKEY: John and Dianne Fowler's friends in

Izmir run a laundromat ministry to refugees offering friendship, English lessons, and other services for families.

- EVANGELICAL THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE OF ADDIS ABABA has been required by several recent events to greatly strengthen its ability to offer online coursework. This funding will provide more computers, internet infrastructure improvements, and recording equipment toward that end.
- PARTNERS FOR HOPE CHILDREN'S CENTER: This grant will provide 18 new treadle sewing machines for Hope Community Centre's new vocational education program in Kinangop, Kenya. (This is Lucy Gacheru's ministry to orphans.)
- TORCHBEARERS FELLOWSHIP IN SOUTH INDIA will translate discipleship and pastor training materials using EMI principles into two more South Indian languages.
- "DELIVERING DIGNITY" CONGO, which Jacky Kalubi initiated during her medical mission trip last summer, will purchase and ship at least 200 ladies' "dignity kits" made in Kenya to the clinic in Congo and train girls to use them, and stay in school.

The Church Nominating Committee (CNC) Elder Dan Ott says, "A distinctive trait of the Presbyterian form of government is that the congregation chooses its lead-



ers. This has been true since John Calvin's day, the mid-1500's. This representative form of governing was even adopted by the founders of the USA." Calvin described *orders* or offices of the church: two types of Elders—teaching ones (pastors and preachers) and governing ones (lay leaders)—and Deacons (who serve and care for the needs of the congregation). The online form has more details on how officers serve inside and beyond the church.

Your Church Nominating Committee (CNC) is asking for you to submit the names of "covenant partners" (members) you would like us to consider. You may even nominate yourself. The CNC will pray earnestly, interview all submissions, and recommend a slate of nominees for the October Congregational Meeting.

The Mission of the *Greater Cincinnati Prayer Canopy* is:

To seek the Lord to raise a canopy of prayer over Greater Cincinnati for Kingdom revival by connecting and uniting worship and prayer effort under the supremacy of Jesus. We desire to partner with the Holy Spirit for our City to be transformed through awakening, disciple making, prayer, healing, and restoration of the Body of Messiah. We are a reconciling body of disciples that unite in prayer to glorify God according to Scripture.

It's been fun to see the enthusiasm for the Greater Cincinnati Prayer Canopy throughout our faith community. Along the way, folks have shared a few questions that might be of interest to you.

Question: I see the "Prayer Guide," but I'm not really sure what to do with it... I don't feel comfortable reading a rote prayer, but I like the idea that the Prayer Canopy gives me a way to impact my hometown. What do I really do with a Prayer Guide?

Answer: You're absolutely correct that you aren't being asked to read the Prayer Guide to God. Yet, we live in a big city and may not be aware of the many things going on

around town that might benefit from prayer. The "Prayer Guide" is simply a tool to communicate some of the opportunities in Greater Cincinnati where we are petitioning God to move. The "Prayer Guide" helps us pray in unity across the entire metro area and provides a way to help the Christian community in Cincinnati to pray with one voice.

Question: An hour seems like a long time – I don't think I can pray for an entire hour.

Answer: An hour may feel like a long time as you get started with the Prayer Canopy. You may want to pray with another person and take turns so that you are sharing the hour. It may help to have a nice cup of coffee or tea or lemonade to fortify you during your prayer. Choose a location where you won't be disturbed so you will be comfortable for the time. You may want to read through the "Prayer Guide" first and maybe make some notes – things to add or focus on that speak to your heart. Just give it a try, and be patient with yourself as you get started.

Question: I see topics in the "Prayer Guide" that I don't know anything about. How can my prayer make a difference when I'm unfamiliar with a

situation?

Answer: God is so kind to us and listens to us no matter what. The "Prayer Guide" may introduce new topics to you, and that may be something God uses to expand your heart or your understanding of our community. God accepts you and your prayer and will bless your efforts. Allow Him to move through your prayer and understanding as you step forward in faith. Just give it a try and see what God does!

Have you ever felt like your prayer was going nowhere and that you just weren't connecting with God? It can be a frustrating or even scary and may discourage your heart. What can you do, and what are ways to connect with God when you feel connection is missing?

It's happened to me, and I think it happens to others. Don't despair! There are things that you can do to "prime the pump" and connect with God in a way that you can sense and experience. Different approaches may work better for certain personality preferences or in even different circumstances. Be willing to try different approaches – don't give up! God appreciates perseverance... remember the widow woman who wore down the judge (Luke 18-1-8). A few ideas:

- · Pray with a prayer partner.
- · Sing some of your favorite worship choruses.
- Enjoy a quiet time with Jesus not *doing* anything, just *being*.
- Journal or write a letter to God that communicates your heart or your frustration or your petition or your desire for God's presence.
- Take a walk in nature or through your neighborhood and thank God for what you see: his creation, his people, his provision, your own health and ability to walk.



We seek to learn about Jesus so that we can do all that God has created us to do. We know that God knows best and Jesus will lead us to what is good for all.

5/29 ASCENSION & REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY: Jesus told his disciples that it was good for him to go away because only then would he send them another Helper, the Spirit of Truth (John 16:7-16). And that's exactly what happened on the day of Pentecost, ten days after Jesus' ascension. Once ascended, Christ gave the gifts of repentance and forgiveness of sin to all believers and the power of the Holy Spirit to accomplish God's Mission (Mt 28:18-20).
