# PLEASANT HILL ACADEMY WHERE GOD'S GLORY IS SHINING BY KELLY HIBBETT, BTN REPORTER

The partnership between CHPC and Pleasant Hill Academy (PHA) continues to bear good fruit. This past summer, CHPC volunteers tutored students and led enrichment classes for the school's Summer Scholars program. Originally 40 children signed up to attend. However, on the first day 120 students showed up. Their families were eager for them to catch up after a challenging year of blended and remote learning. The program was an overwhelming success!



The church's involvement with PHA continues to be fostered by the *Friends of PHA*, a group of CHPCers led by Elder Janet Dumford. The

group provides teacher appreciation events and general support to the staff, students, and families of the school.

Volunteers work in partnership with the Whiz Kids/ Treehouse tutoring programs under the direction of Coleen Scheid



(photo). The group provides a meal each semester; organizes a few staff appreciation events; sends personal thank-you notes, gift cards, and Valentine's Day gift bags; and seeks to provide items when the principal requests them, i.e., 2-liter bottles for science class, backpacks, etc.

When the school closed because

of the pandemic, members of the *Friends of PHA* helped with food distribution, tended the school's garden when the staff that was on a short vacation, and spread cheer through events like a s'mores gift-bag give-aways. In addition to having several people tutoring and leading student enrichment activities at the Summer Scholars program, *Friends of PHA* built bookshelves and garden boxes.

Last month, the group staged a celebratory welcome-back luncheon



for the teachers. A mouth-watering meal from Tortilleria Garcia was served. Colorful gift bags were presented, a prayer room staffed, and

a prayer walk organized. The walk was through the building and focused on seeking God's blessings on all in the school.

PHA's Principal Shauna McDonald recently expressed her gratitude for CHPC's partnership with her school: "I can't thank you enough for the love CHPC has always shown to Pleasant Hill Academy and me. I thank God for the heart you have for ensuring the staff feels appreciated. You may not realize it, but your actions have a special way of changing the atmosphere at Pleasant Hill. I pray God's continued blessings on



each of you. I'm looking for and believing in a supernatural school year for the students

and staff. I trust that God is going to equip the staff to give the students what they need to be great in life!"

#### WHAT CAN YOU DO WITH \$20 AND A BOX OF CRAYONS?

The simple answer is you can bless over 17,000 students whose families often

live below the "poverty line." The students attend 37 schools that receive the supplies from Tools For Schools (TFS) and distribute them on an "as needed" basis. The annual TFS ministry is made possible through donations, grants, and the service of collection and distributions teams.

This year six supplies were offered—2-pocket folders with prongs (25,000);

pens (12,000) #2 pencils (38,000); safety scissors (10,500), washable glue sticks (18,100), and boxes of crayons. TFS supporters in two churches collected 1317

boxes this year, triple previous years. However, 6270 were requested. August 9th was the TFS 2021 Distribution Day. Bev Graves (pictured) and Barry Stare had created the list of schools and items needed. About 9 AM.

GLIMPSES FROM JOERG: From the early 1980's onwards my wife Lisa and I have served Arab people in various ways. We married in 1987 in Cincinnati, and CHPC commissioned us in 1988 to continue our ministry with Operation Mobilization (OM), our mission organization. Since that

time we have been partners with CHPC in Tunisia, Egypt and Jordan as we evangelized, attempted to plant churches and trained others to do so. For a number of years Lisa worked in Social Development. However in 2013 due to our chronic health issues and aging parents, we returned to Germany. We joined an OM team ministering among many immigrants, including Arabs.

Throughout the years of working and living with Arab people, we were looking for a key to unlock their hearts for the Gospel. Though we haven't found a key that would unlock the hearts of the Arab masses, there seems to be a common theme in the conversion process of those Muslim believers who have come to faith in Christ through our ministry in Heilbronn, Germany (near Stuttgart).

They are seeking a religion that enables them to live a moral life of love, forgiveness, and justice. They are fascinated by the Christian

teaching to even love one's enemies (Luke 6:27). Western culture is still perceived as "Christian" and judged on the one hand as corrupt, but at the same time it is perceived as a place where human rights and the *rule of law* exist. Christianity is perceived as a religion of compassion, forgiveness, tolerance and love.
