Message from the Former Moderator

As 2024 opens up to new opportunities and the obligations of 2023 are hung up in my experience closet, I wanted to reflect on my 2 years as moderator.

One thing I believe in whole heartedly, is that SCC is my HOME and the people here are my family. The compassion and grace that was shown to me over the past 2 years, as I did my best, only confirmed my feelings for the church and the people in it. Being moderator taught me so much about the church, how it runs and all the moving pieces that make things happen here or when we are doing God's work outside these walls. But this position also taught me some life lessons of my own. My biggest lesson is compassion with myself and others. I worked with so many different people and saw how different people talk to one another, think things through and work. Not everyone thinks and prioritizes like I do and that's ok! God made everyone different not only in looks, but how they react, think and operate. So I learned to stop and listen to people and really hear what they were saying because that helped me be a better leader when I understood the person better. It is so easy to go in that dark place and then continue to spread the negativity and in turn, darken others hearts. Being moderator I heard some negative things and I saw people being treated (or they thought they were being treated) badly. Instead of spreading the negative, I would try and stop the spread of darkness. I would look for a different and better outcome for a situation, or try and think how the other person was feeling and why they might react or feel that way. I did a lot more asking questions and a lot less assuming I knew what others were thinking. Not only did I free myself from the dark negatives, but my heart felt lighter and more full of love. Just like God said it would. Deciding to be positive was a decision I had to make every time the negative gossip or feelings came into my ears and heart. But, overtime it has become easier for me to do this. My hope is that everyone will try to be more positive in everything and not get sucked into the negative. "This little light of mine, I'm going to let it shine" should become our motto!

My past 2 years as moderator have been good times and not great times, but I wouldn't trade any of it. I want to tell you all how much more I have fallen in love with Speedway Christian Church and that this position that I was terrified of, has brought my heart closer to God. He didn't move me to step up as moderator to just help the church, but God had some great lessons he knew I would learn. So let me say THANK YOU to the people of SCC for trusting me with the position of Moderator for 2 years. Your love, kind words and support mean more to me than you know.
