Summer Worship at Speedway Christian Church

At Speedway Christian Church, there's a lot that we do as a congregation. One of the most visible things we do I s worship. Worship is such an important part of who we are. The prayers we pray, the words we say together, the songs we sing, our presence at the Lord's Table are all part of the liturgy of our time together in worship. The word **liturgy** comes from a Greek word that mean, "the work of the people." If our worship is the work of the people, it is our responsibility to fully participate both physically and spiritually. And occasionally, that work requires us to evaluate what we are doing to ensure that the worship we offer to God is authentic and accessible.

This summer, worship at Speedway Christian Church will look a little bit different as we pause for some congregation-wide evaluation. Beginning June 2 and going through July 28, we will have one worship service, Sunday at 9:15am. We will worship together as one church for the summer. During the month of June, I will be holding listening sessions as we evaluate our time of worship together. These listening sessions are open to anyone in the congregation. I have also scheduled some time to meet with the youth and the children of our church. I will gather all the responses from the listening sessions and in July, the board will spend some prayerful and intentional time to discern what, if anything, could change or be enhanced with our worship offerings at Speedway Christian Church. We do not enter this process with an agenda for change. Instead, we enter this process to discern what opportunities we have to enliven and elevate the worship experience. We enter this experience in hopes that our work as the body of Christ in this place offers glory to God in the most genuine and faithful way. In the end, it is a possibility that nothing will change. It is a possibility that several things could change. Whatever comes of this process, we will do this work together and with open communication.

During June and July while we are worshipping together as one church, there will also be some special Faith Formation opportunities. More information on those opportunities is coming soon.

To kick off the summer worship schedule, there will be a fellowship meal on Thursday, May 30 at 6:30pm, details to come.

My husband, John takes him to mass during the week and they have become great pals. It is so cool to watch – you would LOVE TQ. He was a baseball player in high school and college. This guy truly loves Jesus and talks all the time about his faith.

Anyway, he has had some falls and took a very serious one on Saturday. We learned about this on Monday and John and I went to visit him in ICU on Tuesday. I put the little Jesus in my pocket and when we got there, I said "Hey, TQ, I though you could use a little Jesus" and pulled it out. He got a HUGE smile and has kept it right next to him since I gave it to him. John was there again yesterday and TQ mentioned it.
