
"We are so grateful for all the incredible volunteers

Speedway Christian Pentecost Celebration **Sunday, June 8, 2025**

Yards of sheer red fabric streamed high across the sanctuary on Pentecost Sunday, June 8, as we celebrated the beginning of the Christian church.

The bright red banners symbolized the flames of the Holy Spirit, that a large group of believers experienced 50 days after the Passover, where Jesus was crucified, resurrected and then ascended into heaven.

Elder Tom Smith read the Pentecost story from the second chapter of Acts that included, "they were together in one place, and suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues of fire, appeared among them and a tongue rested on each of them. All were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak as the Spirit gave them the ability."

During the Children's Moment, Rev. Katie Griffin led a spirited singing of "happy birthday to the church" in honor of the founding of the universal church, with a promise to the children of birthday cupcakes during Worship and Wonder.

Rev. Kyle Hunter's sermon reminded the congregation the Good News of Christ has the capacity to change our lives. Life is often hard, but as at the first Pentecost, it's up to us to decide how we respond. Sharing the Good News of hope and redemption is truly "the rest of our stories."

Blessing bags

Many of our neighbors do not have homes. We see these people on the street corner, outside of grocery stores, and other places. We want to do something to help, but it feels overwhelming. Our youth group has made some bags to give to these homeless neighbors. These bags contain many simple pleasures we take for granted – a toothbrush and toothpaste, a pair of socks, fingernail clippers, chapstick, bandaids, snacks, and a bottle of water. We call them Blessing Bags and you will find them in the Hall of Light.

- Grab a bag or two.
- Put it in an accessible place in your car (so you can get to it easily when driving and you see someone).
- Give it to a neighbor in need. This simple effort could make a big difference.

What Is a Prayerground — and Why Do We Have One?

I'm sure you have noticed a special place in our sanctuary that we call a prayerground. A **prayerground** is a designated area within the sanctuary for young children to engage in quiet play, coloring, and listening during worship. It's an intentional invitation for our youngest members to be fully present in the life of the church.

Why a Prayerground?

At Speedway Christian Church, we believe that children are not just the future of the church—they are the church *right now*. Jesus welcomed children with open arms and reminded his followers that the kingdom of God belongs to children as these. The prayerground reflects that same welcome. Here are a few reasons we've created a prayerground:

Inclusion: When sitting in a pew, children often cannot see or hear well. By having a space created just for children, where they can see and experience everything, the prayerground lets them know that they belong here, too.

Engagement: Children learn by seeing, hearing, and doing. When they sit in worship – even with crayons or small toys– they absorb the rhythms of faith and worship life.

Hospitality: It communicates to visitors and members alike that children are valued and celebrated, not tolerated.

Grace: It reminds all of us that worship doesn't have to be silent or perfect to be sacred. A little joyful noise and movement can be signs of life and growth.

What It's Not

The prayerground isn't a playground. It isn't a place to distract the kids during worship or a substitute for parenting. It's a space for kids to be involved in the life of the church. It is our hope that when you start out knowing that you are a valued part of the church, you will continue to want to be a part of the life of the church long into the future.

How Can You Help?

Even if you don't have little ones, you can be part of making the prayerground successful:

- Offer a smile or word of encouragement to families.
- When you meet new families with young children, mention the prayerground and that their whole family is always welcome in worship.

Model grace and flexibility – remember, the church is supposed to be a little messy and full of life. A church with small voices is a church that is growing. By making room for all ages in our sanctuary, we live more fully into our identity as the body of Christ—diverse, interdependent, and welcoming to all. So next time you see a child scribbling a picture of Jesus, give thanks. The Spirit is at work, with crayons in hand.
