## The Gospel

The Gospel is the joyous declaration  
that God is redeeming the world through Christ  
and that He commands everyone everywhere  
to repent from sin and trust Jesus Christ for salvation.

Each of us has sinned against God,

But because of his love, God sent His Son, Jesus,

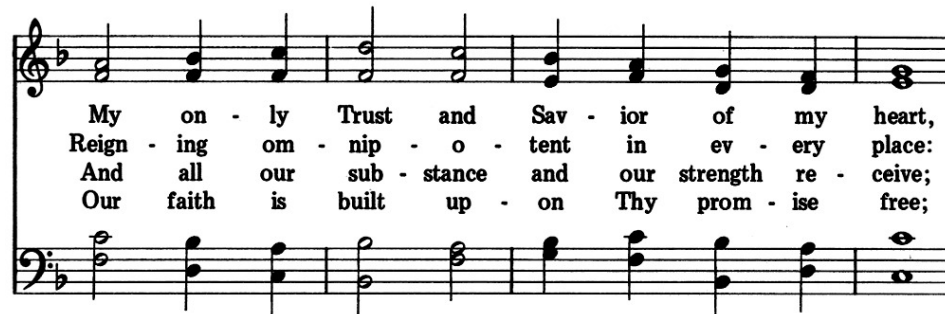

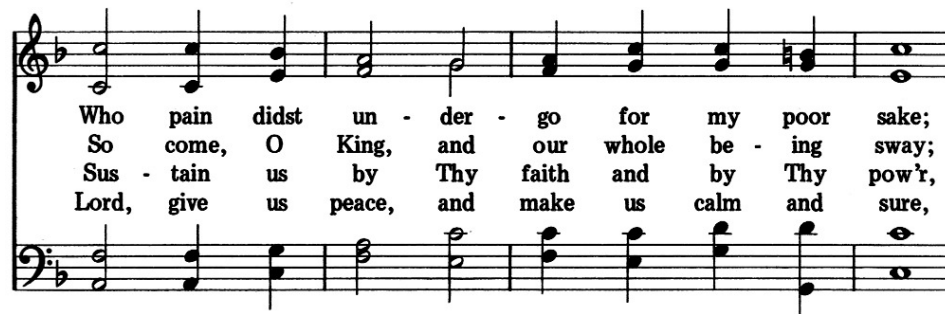

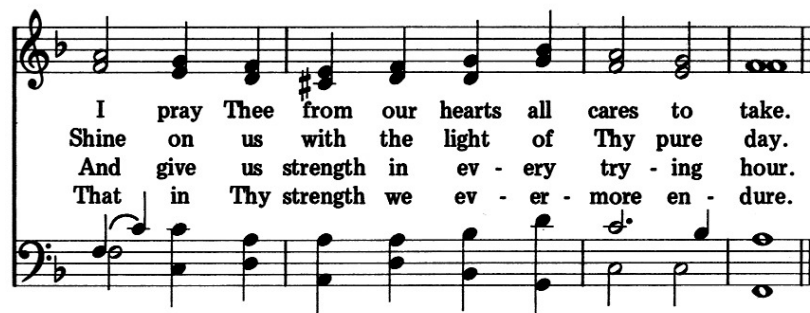
