# Evening Message – Elder Address: Law and Gospel

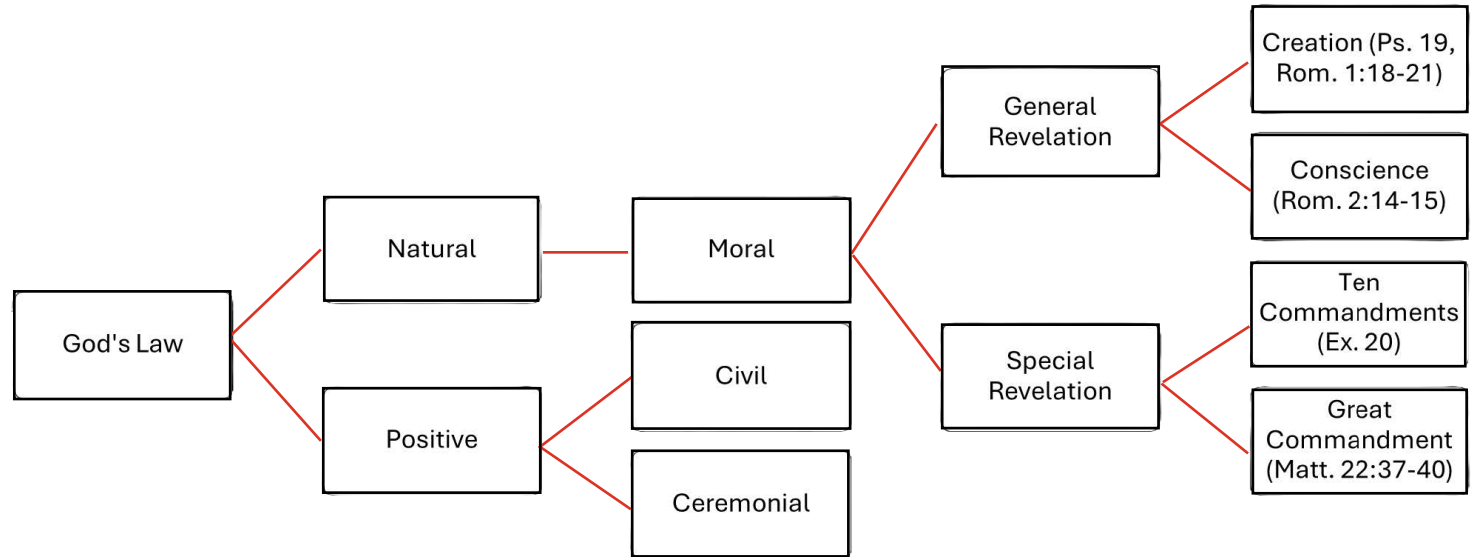
## Main Idea:
