1 Peter 3:8-14

How does Peter tell us to respond when the world is on edge?

1. Stick _____

Live in harmony with one another; be sympathetic, love as brothers, be compassionate and humble. 1 Peter 3:8

2. Speak _____

Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult, but with **blessing**, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing. For, "Whoever would love life and see good days must **keep his tongue from evil** and his lips from deceitful speech. 1 Peter 3:9-10

3. Seek _____

...turn from evil and **do good... seek peace** and **pursue it**. 1 Peter 3:11

4. Stop _____

"Do not fear what they fear; **do not be frightened**." 1 Peter 3:14 (Quoting Isaiah 8:13)

QUESTIONS

For personal reflection or group discussion

2. Read 1 Peter 3:9-10. When do you most struggle with speaking positively? Why is that? What standard of speech do these verses call you to? How can you do that today?

3. Read 1 Peter 3:11-13. What is one way you can pursue peace in your life and relationships today?

4. Read Isaiah 8:11-13 & 1 Peter 3:14. What is happening in the world around you right now that causes you to fear? What truths about God can you focus on that will diminish your fears?

5. Read 1 Peter 4:19. What are the two things Peter tells us to do in this verse? How can you do them today?
