GUEST SPEAKER: DR. AMY ORR-EWING

Amy has spoken in 40 countries and is frequently interviewed on TV, radio and podcasts. She's spoken at the UK Parliament, on Capitol Hill, and to West Wing staff at the White House. She holds a doctorate in Theology from the University of Oxford, previously served as President of the Oxford Centre for Christian Apologetics, and is an honorary lecturer at the University of Aberdeen. She's the author of multiple books including "Where is God in All the Suffering?", "Why Trust the Bible?" and "Mary's Voice."

SCRIPTURE: LUKE 1:46-55

And Mary said:

"My soul magnifies the Lord
and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,
for he has been mindful
of the humble state of his servant.

From now on all generations will call me blessed,
for the Mighty One has done great things for me—
holy is his name.

His mercy extends to those who fear him,
from generation to generation.
He has performed mighty deeds with his arm;
he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts.

He has brought down rulers from their thrones
but has lifted up the humble.
He has filled the hungry with good things
but has sent the rich away empty.

He has helped his servant Israel,
remembering to be merciful
to Abraham and his descendants forever,
just as he promised our ancestors."

NOTES:

QUESTIONS *For personal reflection or group discussion*

1. Read Luke 1:46-56. In these words we see Mary's response to God coming into the horizon of her life. How did God come on to the horizon of your life and how did you respond?
2. Re-read Luke 1:46-56. What do you typically think of when you think of Mary, the mother of Jesus? What do you learn about Mary in this song of praise? What do you learn about God in this Mary's song of praise?
3. Re-read Luke 1:46-56. How does knowing how God called, empowered and elevated Mary encourage you? How do you struggle to believe that God could call and empower you to do work for Him?
4. For one more time this week, soak in Luke 1:46-56. How has this passage encouraged you this week? What is one way you can apply what you've learned in this passage in your life this week?
