QUESTIONS For personal reflection or group discussion

1. Read Matthew 9:9-13. It is easy for us to point fingers at the Pharisees, but most of us have a similar struggle. If the Pharisees had understood the heart of God and not just the law of God, how might they have responded with compassion towards the "sinners"?

We may not have asked Jesus' disciples why he eats with "tax collectors and sinners", but we have a group in mind. Take a moment for honest reflection. What lines have you drawn with a group of people, type of person, that Jesus would cross?

- 2. Read Matthew 12:1-8. What would it look like for you to be an agent of God's healing to the people around you?
- 3. Read Luke 10:38-42. Like Martha, what are some of the things of life that can distract you from time with Jesus? What can you do this week to help you be more present with God?
- 4. Read Ephesians 2:4-9. Starting with the grace you see in these verses, make a list of how the Lord has shown you "Hessed" (unfailing or devoted love and grace) since the start of this year.
- 5. Read Hosea 6:6 and Micah 6:8. Take some time in reflection and prayer today. As you look at your own life and heart, where have you fallen into the trap of making your faith about the rules and rituals but forgotten the heart of God?
