To *consecrate* means to set apart and make sacred. Christians follow Jesus' invitation to gather around the Table and consecrate bread and wine at the Eucharist, through which the elements become sacred to us. At the end of October, we celebrate Consecration Sunday, during which we state our intentions to consecrate (set apart) a portion of our income to God's special purposes through the

ministries of St. Mary's Church in the next calendar year. Consecration Sunday is always a joyful day because we celebrate together so many of the ways that our church family is able to serve in Jesus' name and be a witness to His love in the world! Because God first gives to us, we are able to participate in God's blessings to others. And now that we enter into a new month, I am moved to state the obvious: consecration isn't reserved for a day or a season. Every one of our days is a gift from God and we are called to be set apart in this world, dedicated to God's call in our lives. Some of us are called to particular seasons of ministry in particular roles... I hope you'll pay attention to the Vestry discernment process below, as well as the many other opportunities to *serve with JOY* throughout this BellRinger. But all of us are called to prayerfully discern and follow God's unique invitation to bear the Gospel in our everyday living. A song comes to mind that puts it another way: Alison Krauss' A Living Prayer. Check it out when you can. May God bless our intentions to consecrate our seasons, our gifts, ourselves to follow in the Way of Jesus today.



Vestry News

Vestry Nomination Process

The Vestry of St. Mary's has a vital role in the leadership of this parish, and St. Mary's will soon elect its next 4-person class of vestry leaders.

- 1. On October 13, a preliminary list of members who are eligible to serve on the vestry was posted in the church. The parish office needed any necessary corrections by Monday, October 30.
- 2. In November, nomination forms will be emailed and posted in the Narthex with instructions on the "Nomination by Ballot" process.
- 3. The Vestry's Nominating Committee (consisting of the 4 out-going members) will form a 4-person candidate slate based on the nomination ballots received. In the event of a tie, the Nominating Committee is entrusted to discern an appropriate solution based on the needs of the parish.



4. The Annual Parish Meeting will take place during the 10:30am liturgy on Sunday, December 10, 2023 during which the 4-person slate will be voted on. Please plan now to attend worship this joyous day!

Serving on the Vestry of St. Mary's Church is service to our Lord and is an honor and privilege. Please be in prayer for discernment about who you sense may be called to serve in this way. May God bless the leadership of this church.


