What is it that you hope for? And to where do you turn as the source of the hopes that you have?

As followers of Jesus, December usually includes the beginning of the season in which we are drawn back to our most fundamental hopes: to be known by God and to live in God's presence forever. The season of Advent, which begins this year on Sunday, December 3 and lasts until Christmas Eve, is designed to help us orient our lives so that this hope (and its answer!) is front and center. When we gather for our Sunday liturgies this Advent, you'll notice many things that are unique to the season... wreath, nativity scene, Marian blue colors. Another will be our singing of a few verses each week of the Advent hymn "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" as our processional hymn. It is certainly among the most familiar songs of the season. A little bit of musical trivia: the beginnings of each verse are called the "O Antiphons" because each one begins with the word "O" before describing a distinct characteristic or name of God: Wisdom, Lord of might, Branch of Jesse's tree, Key of David, Dayspring from on high, Desire of nations. And, as is the case with so many hymns, this one is also a prayer. So as we sing, we join in prayer with countless others throughout history who yearn and wait for the coming of Christ. We wait, on the one hand, for the coming of our annual celebration of the birth of Jesus at Christmas, and also for His coming again in glory and great power to reign as our "King of Peace."

Friends, as we wait, may we take to heart the gifts that our Advent Scripture readings bear. They point us towards repentance and renewal, trust and hope in God's promises, and ultimately joy in knowing that God truly is with us, no matter what each day or season holds. May we hold these things front and center as we share this Advent and Christmas time together!


Annual Volunteer & Donor Holiday Gathering
