From the Rector

"Even now," declares the LORD, "return to me with all your heart..." -Joel 2:12

In recent Sundays, our gatherings for liturgy have involved parables of Jesus as recorded in Luke's Gospel: the Lost Sheep, the Lost Coin, the Lost/Prodigal Son, and the Unjust Steward. These parables have all been described as ways that Jesus illustrates the never-exhausting, and therefore always-surprising, grace of God. As we've explored them together, I have wondered how the Holy Spirit, through them, has changed me (or would like for me change). It's a question that I often wonder and am on the lookout for because I believe that a change of heart within me (and anyone) is always possible with God, and especially when there is an encounter with the Word of God and the Sacraments... thanks be to God! And that is what the church gathers in worship, in service, in fellowship, and in any other way: to encounter the Living God, to be transformed, and to be sent out for God's purposes in this world.

Although the passage from the book of the prophet Joel that is highlighted here is usually read during Lent, it stands out to me also in this time because of our many "returnings" this time of year: a return from summertime rhythms, perhaps a return to "church" altogether (welcome home!), and certainly a return for all of us to the Program Year. May you find opportunities here (at St. Mary's and in this BellRinger) for joyful, authentic, and charitable life together... and may we all be transformed and sent in joyful service to the Risen Lord Jesus!



Consecration Sunday is Coming - November 9th!




Consecration Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes. St. Mary's

Vestry has selected the New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis. New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?" Each Sunday, beginning October 19, we will have a guest speaker during the announcements period of our service, and we will welcome a guest preacher, The Rev. Ronald G. Abrams, on Sunday, November 2nd. Then, on Consecration Sunday, November 9th, we will have only one service (10:30am liturgy). We will have a brief period of instruction and inspiration that concludes with an opportunity for members to make their commitments as a confidential act of worship. Every attendee and member who completes an Estimate of Giving Card does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday, either online or in-person. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card. We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. Immediately following the 10:30am liturgy, we will share a time of food and fellowship with a catered banquet in Moseley Hall. Please keep this time in our church life in your prayers, and we give thanksgivings for your enthusiastic participation in Consecration Sunday!



Fr. Ron began his ministry in New York where he was Assistant Rector of St. Mark's in Westhampton Beach from 1982-1984, followed by seven years as Rector of St. Ann's church in Bridgehampton from 1984-1991. In 1991, Fr. Ron embarked on a new chapter, coming to North Carolina as Rector of Holy Trinity church in Fayetteville. During his time there, he devoted himself to supporting military families and shared his expertise as a guest lecturer for the Bishop of the Armed Forces at conferences in Japan and Germany. He then served a 20-year tenure as Rector of St. James' Parish in Wilmington from 1999-2019, followed by serving as Priest-in-Charge at Holy Trinity Church in Hampstead from 2019-2025. Most recently, Fr. Ron has served as the Summer Ministry Coordinator for the worship community on Figure 8 Island, NC. Fr. Ron is married to Kathleen, an accomplished interior designer, and together they have two sons and four grandchildren.

how they might fit into your everyday prayer life. And then later in October, join us as we begin a study the Song of Solomon.




